VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 19, 2017

g Minutes: - M-S-A to accept the

Vestry Meeting Minutes: - M-S-A to accept the November 21, 2017 minutes.

Treasurers Report: Nick reported that the numbers for December looked good. He reported that we are under budget in almost every expense category. Our 2017 income was more than what was expected. The deficit is expected to be less than \$39,000 for the year. Nick said he thought that we were fiscally responsible with our spending in 2017 and planning for 2018. The endowment fund is doing very well right now.

*The transition to the new bank (Key Bank) wasn't as seamless as originally thought. The transition is expected to be done in February.

Treasurers Report: **-M-S-A** to accept Treasurers Report for November 2017.

2018 Budget: The Abundant Life Church, who was renting some of our space, has decided to close down. Their last gathering will be held on 12/27/17. We will decrease the 2018 budget building use income by \$4,140.

*To date we have received pledges for 2018 in the amount of \$130,000.

2018 Budget: **-M-S-A** to accept 2018 Budget with amended income amount.

Housing Allowance Resolution: The Housing Allowance resolution that must be entered into the official minutes of the Vestry was presented.

Rector Housing Allowance portion of the 2018 Budget: -M-S-A to accept the Rector Housing Allowance portion of the 2018 Budget.

MMR: We will start the 30 minutes per Vestry meeting discussions in January.

Vestry Retreat: There will be a retreat for new and existing Vestry members on Friday, February 9 from 6 to 9pm and Saturday, February 10 from 9-3:30pm.

Rector's Report:

- *Rev. Jimmie Sue continues to make phone calls and visits to parishioners; she is making about 5 to 7 visits per month.
- * Rev. Jimmie Sue has an opportunity to attend an all-expense paid trip to an Evangelism Conference in Cleveland, in March, around the time of the Rummage Sale. She will be gone for two and a half days.
- *The Wardens, Jimmie Sue and Nick will begin the Parochial Report in January.
- *Jimmie Sue is working with WordPress dealing with the problem of loading sermons.
- *Most visitors are finding us on Facebook or from our web site.
- *Another Euchre night is being planned; first one was a lot of fun.
- *Ask the Rector a question is going well.
- *Ryers supplied a Music Report. He is planning an Evensong Service beginning in January ending in the spring, Wednesdays, once a month. He is lining up a cantor and musicians.

REPORTS AND HOUSEKEEPING:

Formation Committee: Don said that about 30 people, including some people from Webster, have signed up for the Boston trip. They need 40 people to make the trip happen. If they don't have 40 people then they may postpone the trip and try another date. The first payment will be due January 7, 2018.

The next Vestry Meeting will be on Tuesday, January 16, 2018 at 7pm. Also, a meeting is planned for Sunday, January 28, 2018 following the Annual Meeting for about an hour.

Vestry Meeting Minutes: -M-S-A to accept the December 19, 2017 minutes.

Treasurers Report: **-M-S-A** to accept Treasurers Report for December 19, 2017.

Nick reported December was better than expected. Deficit of \$30,000.00. Expenses were all under budget. We will save \$2,000.00 with the new copier and maintenance contract. Endowment fund doing well. It was agreed that quarterly financial reports to the parish was beneficial and should continue.

Treasurers Report: -M-S-A to accept Treasurers Report for December 19, 2017.

Action Items (Require Vestry Action/Vote):

Jimmie Sue discussed information that she had received from Todd Rubiano, CFO of the Diocese, regarding the Sarah A. Jones Fund. The Vestry made a unanimous motion and approved the motion to accept and deposit \$1,000.00 from the Sarah A. Jones Fund from the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester Trustees into a new line item non-operating account, and not into a General Fund. The money will remain in the account until a need is determined.

-M-S-A to take a \$1,000.00 pull from the Sarah A. Jones Fund.

MMR: Discussion was postponed until the February 20, 2018 Vestry meeting.

Vestry Retreat: There will be a Vestry retreat at Church of the Epiphany, for new and existing Vestry members on Friday, February 9, from 6:00pm to 9:00pm and Saturday, February 10, from 9:00am to 3:30pm. Canon Johnnie will be the facilitator.

Rector's Report:

- *Jimmie Sue continues to make phone calls and visits.
- *Christmas Eve services were lovely. It was great to see extended family members.
- * "Degreening" went well. Many hands make light work.
- * Deb Grasso and Adam Metzinger were recognized and given gifts for their service to the Vestry and to the Church.
- *Vestry members were encouraged to attend the January 31st Café. A representative from the Gates Police Department will speak on church safety and answer questions as requested.

- *Adam Metzinger and James D'Anunzio will be recognized at the 10:00 am service on January 21, 2018 for their service to the acolytes.
- *Bishop Singh will make his annual visit on Sunday, February 25, 2018. A reception will follow the 10:00 am service.
- *Don and Jack have picked the first 6 Red Wing game dates.

REPORTS AND HOUSEKEEPING:

Formation Committee: The Boston trip has been postponed until July due to low enrollment.

Next Meeting Sunday, January 28th after Annual Meeting.

Lent is nearly arrived and perhaps you're looking for a Lenten discipline as I am. And perhaps folks have noticed from my sermons that prayer and reflection have been on my mind quite a bit lately. I've been thinking about how

prayer has changed me and changed my life, made me a better person, and keeps me connected and working on my relationship with God. I've been finding that I've had to mix things up a bit in my spiritual life, I was getting a little stuck and having a hard time focusing during prayer.

Also in my reflecting I've been thinking a lot about listening and seeing, how the two go together and complement one another. Which led me to thinking about drawing. I used to love to draw as kid, but as I got older the inner critic got louder and louder until I barely picked up a pencil. I'd dabble here and there or make a "special" drawing for a loved one or close friend but those were few and far between.

So one Monday morning at the library, wandering down the aisles (I love to see what will pull me in), there was a drawing book. I checked it out but I didn't really do anything with it past chapter one. I did however ask for a pencil set for Christmas and got one. Then I used my Christmas money and bought a book called "You Can Draw in 30 Days" by Mark Kistler. And this will be my Lenten practice: gently working on softening my inner critic to find joy once again in drawing. The exercises are 20 minutes every day for 30 days, I think in doing this I will find that my prayer life begins to find its focus again, and perhaps a love of drawing will reemerge.

Ask the Rector a Question

This month's question is: When is God coming back to earth?

Response comes from *An Episcopal Dictionary of* the Church and is an excerpt from the definition on salvation. "The gospel proclaims the good news of salvation in Christ (see In 3:16-17). We may participate in a saving process of sanctification by which the saving life of Christ is increasingly the reality of our own lives. This process is completed and revealed in Christ, and it is begun in us through faith in him. Completed union with God is the end of this saving process. In Christ, we come to be at one with God. This union with God is not yet completed, and the eschatological [end of times] Kingdom of God is not yet fulfilled. But the coming of the Kingdom of God has been inaugurated by Christ. The Kingdom of God was revealed in Jesus, who ate with outcasts, forgave sinners, healed the sick, and raised the dead (see Lk 5:17-32; Jn 11:1-44).

We are now in the "in between times." We can know the present reality of salvation in Christ, even though the Kingdom of God is not yet complete in our world, our church, or our hearts. The fulfillment of the Kingdom of God is associated with Jesus' second coming in power and glory. Our hope is that all humanity and all creation will be united in God's love in the fullness of time, and that "nothing, not even death, shall separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (BCP, p. 862; see Rom 8:38-39)."


