From early times Christians have observed the week before Easter as a time of special devotion. The pilgrim Egeria recorded in the late fourth century that Jerusalem contained many sacred places and these were sites for devotion and liturgy. Egeria and other pilgrims visited these

sacred places within Jerusalem to follow the path of Jesus in his last days. They formed processions, worshipped where Christ suffered and died, and venerated relics. From this beginning, and over time our rites have evolved from this beginning. Today we observe Holy Week as Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Holy Week will end at sundown on the Saturday before Easter, oftentimes celebrated with the Easter Vigil. These services enable us to enter into the space and events leading us through the last days of Jesus' life and to his resurrection.

Where do we find ourselves as we continue to walk through Lent? How are these 40 days being used to shape our hearts and our awareness of God in our lives? How is our Lent helping us prepare for Holy Week?

When we enter Holy Week it is our attempt to understand, to feel all that Christ felt, and in doing so bring us closer to Christ, to each other, to our neighbors. To fill us with an empathy that overflows with love and courage, and a willingness to use our voices for the betterment of all.

#### **Ask the Rector a Question**

This month's question is: Why do we have two creeds?

Both creeds, the Apostle's Creed and the Nicene Creed, are a statement about our faith and of our basic beliefs about God. When we say either of the creeds we join with Christians throughout the

ages in affirming our faith in the one God who created us, redeemed us, and sanctifies us. (http://www.episcopalchurch.org/page/cree ds)

The Apostle's Creed is the ancient creed of Baptism and so this is the creed we say when a person is to be baptized; this is also the creed we say in daily Morning and Evening Prayer. The Nicene Creed is the creed of the universal Church and it summarizes the Christian faith, this is the creed we say at Holy Eucharist.

We actually have a third creed, the Athanasian Creed, and this creed is an ancient document proclaiming the nature of the Incarnation and of God as Trinity. You can find this creed in the Historical Documents section of the Book of Common Prayer.

#### FEBRUARY STEWARD OF THE MONTH – FIBER MINISTRY - BIRDIE AMES

#### Tell us a little about the Fiber Ministry?

The Fiber Ministry is part of Service Ministry. It started at a retreat held by Julie Cicora and was originally the Prayer Shawl Ministry. In years past our goal was to get "40 shawls in 40 days". Today seeing that we are smaller it is "40 items in 40 days". The items are made from any kind of fiber by knitting, crocheting or sewing. The items are given away to members of the parish, or in the community who need prayers or simply need to know someone is thinking about them. We have given shawls to those in hospitals, ill at home, or lonely. As our young adults graduate high school, we give them a blanket to take with them. We have made baby hats for preemies. Each item is blessed and placed in a zip-lock bag with a written prayer enclosed.

#### What does Stewardship mean to you and your ministry area?

Stewardship means using my gifts give of myself and show I care about fellow parishioners and others in the community.

#### What does it mean to you to give back by serving in this ministry area

It gives me a time of quiet reflection.

#### How can someone become involved in Fiber Ministry?

#### **Service Ministry Update**

The response from Epiphany for the "Souper Bowl" food collection was fantastic!!! We collected 420 cans of soup, chili, macaroni's and non-perishable food items that were donated to St. Theodore's food pantry. A big thanks to Donna, Doug and Corey Craig for delivery of all the food to St. Theodore's.

We have two new service projects for the Lent season. For the creative parishioners, we are having a fiber ministry project which will end on Easter Sunday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. We are looking for items that people can knit, crochet, or sew such as

prayer shawls, blankets, hats, scarfs, mitten or gloves. Our goal is to have at least 40 items to commemorate the 40 days of Lent.

Our other service ministry project for Lent is for those who want to help others and like to shop. See the article in the STAR and bulletin about donating six Easter Food baskets which will be distributed by the Gates police Department so that 6 families in need can enjoy an Easter dinner. The sign-up board for volunteers will be in the main hallway at church and the food and gift cards need to be at church by March 25<sup>th</sup> so they can be delivered before Easter.

Our April service projects is for those who enjoy working in a warehouse. We will be working at Foodlink on Tuesday, April 24<sup>th</sup> from 6-8pm. We will be looking for 10 volunteers. More detail will be forthcoming and the sign-up sheet will be posted in mid-March.

Special treat such as pickle, relish, candies, etc.)








