Stewardship Corner

The Episcopal Church defines stewardship as: What I do, with all that I have, after I say, "I believe." and Using the gifts God has given us, to do the work God is calling us to do.

Christian stewardship is grateful and responsible use of God's gifts in the light of God's purpose as revealed in Jesus Christ. Christian stewards, empowered by the Holy Spirit, commit themselves to conscious, purposeful decisions.

Stewardship is lived out in:

- Living and telling the good news
- Sharing God in seeking justice, peace, and the integrity of creation in an interdependent universe
- Wisely employing God-given human resources, abilities, and relationships
- Sharing the material resources we hold and giving them in service, justice, and compassion
- Providing for future generations, sharing in the life, worship, and responsible stewardship of the Church and of its mission
- Stewardship is a joyful act for the individual, the community and for the sake of God's world.

This definition comes from the standing rules of the Ecumenical Stewardship Center. The Episcopal Church is a founding member of this group and remains active in its continuing work.



UNITED THANK OFFERING (UTO)

Our Annual UTO In-Gathering is October 14 and October 21. United Thank Offering (UTO) is a ministry of The Episcopal Church for the mission of the whole church. Through United Thank Offering, men, women, and children nurture the habit of giving daily thanks to God. These prayers of thanksgiving start when we recognize and name our many daily blessings. Those who participate in UTO discover that thankfulness leads to generosity. United Thank Offering is entrusted to promote thank offerings, to receive the offerings, and to distribute the UTO monies to support mission and ministry throughout The Episcopal Church and in invited Provinces of the Anglican Communion in the developing world. Mite boxes are available on the table in the hallway. All of the collected UTO monies will be offered up by our parish at the Diocesan Convention at the end of October.



CHURCH OF EPIPHANY GROWTH PLAN 2019

As some of you know, the church has been talking about growth for a few years.

We have done surveys in the past, and came up with a few areas that we wanted to focus on.

When we were going thru our search for a new rector, we were focused on "Joyful Noise" in Our Sunday service and Adult Formation.

Now we have our "Top 5 Mindfulness Categories".

- Mission and Purpose (Includes Social Media / Technology)
- Welcome and Invitation (Includes Special Events)
- Liturgy (Includes Music)
- Children and Youth Leadership development (Includes Service Opportunities)
- Adult Formation

Going forward, we are asking that everyone at Epiphany participate in 1 of these 5 categories.

We believe that participation is crucial to Epiphany's growth. We are not asking you to run anything or do anything that is out of your comfort zone. We just want YOU to participate.

We will be putting up a sheet of paper for each of the 5 Mindful Categories.

In the next couple weeks we are asking EVERYONE in the parish to put your name under one of the categories you feel you want to participate in.

Epiphany has so much to offer and the only way to experience what we have, is to participate.

We are not just talking about attending a lunch or a dinner or a social hour. We are talking about Sunday services. Epiphany needs YOU NOW. With everyone's participation, we will not be just a few people on a committee, or a few people on the Vestry. We will be a whole Church parish building a larger Church family.

What is a Qualified Charitable Distribution from an IRA Account?

Would you like to make your 2019 pledge and not pay taxes on your gift in spite of the new tax laws? If you meet certain conditions, you may be able to make a charitable contribution from your IRA without reporting additional income. Here's how it works.

IRS rules mandate that individuals age 70 1/2 and older take Required Minimum Distributions (R?MS) from their IRA each year, regardless of whether the income is needed. These annual withdrawals are subject to ordinary income taxes. But, there is a provision in the tax code that allows retirees age 70 1/2 and older to donate up to \$100,000 tax free from their IRA each year if the distribution is made directly to charity. This

allows you to satisfy your RMD amount without reporting additional income.

The distribution is not included in your income so you avoid the potential negative consequences that regular IRA withdrawals in retirement can create, including taxes on Social Security benefits. The IRA Trustee or custodian must make the distribution directly to the charity. Distributions made payable to the IRA owner and transferred to the charity do not qualify.

You should always talk to your financial representative or tax advisor before making a decision that alters your tax situation.

Dear Parishioners of Epiphany!

Thank you so much for your continued support and participation in the musical activities of Epiphany! With the preparatory season of Advent fast-approaching (Just under 4 months until Christmas!!!), it is time to restart our interest in music! I want to personally invite all of you to come and join us! Whether your voice is big or small, high or low, all are welcome to share the gift that God gave us each in the human voice!

You may say that "I can't sing, I'm not musical!" But my friends you are, just let the Holy Spirit fill you and guide you in song. You do not have to be like Lady Gaga or Tony Bennett, or Aretha

Franklin to lift up your voices and Praise God - he loves your voice because it is your own. To me, an earnest hymn, sung with a full heart is better for the soul than an opera or a praise band concert.

If you are a musician of any kind, we will welcome you into the fold with open arms: There is room at God's table for everyone, whether they are pianists, jaw-harpists, flautists, trumpeters or percussionists - each can find their role in the beat of God's eternal anthem of Love!

Along with this invitation to join us in song and play, this note is an introduction to some of the wonderful soulful changes that will be beginning at Epiphany. Starting with the First Sunday in Advent we will be offering a new, seasonal gospel acclamation: "Come, Lord Jesus! Come and be born in our hearts!" which will last through the Christmas season. The text and sheet music for this will be provided in the weekly bulletin. There will also be an additive closing hymn, where each week we will add a verse. The hymn for Advent will be "O Come, O come, Emmanuel". During the Season of Epiphany, we will begin singing the Lord's Prayer as a congregation, to connect in a different way with the bold words our Savior taught us. As we begin again the annual journey of the church calendar, we will be introducing a form of responsorial Psalm that will allow the congregation to experience the text of the Psalm in song.


