Call for Nominations

Yes, it is the time of year to prayerfully consider serving Epiphany on the Vestry, as a Warden, or as a Diocesan Convention Delegate. How does one get nominated for an office or nominate a friend or acquaintance for an office?

Two of the objectives of the Nominating Policy are:

- (1) To identify candidates whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at a particular point in its life.

- (2) To provide sufficient time to check and ensure that potential nominees meet canonical and Epiphany's qualifications for the office for which they are nominated. If not, the policy provides time for them to meet the qualifications.

As you consider who to nominate, please think first of people whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at this time. Then, please remember that all people nominated must meet the qualifications to vote at parish meetings, and eligibility requirements for the office for which they are nominated. Qualifications and eligibility requirements are

set forth in national canons, Diocesan canons, Parish Charter and approved Vestry motions.

Qualifications to Vote at Parish Meetings

All of the following:

- 18 years old or older.
- Belong to the parish (baptized, confirmed, received or transferred in from an Episcopal Church, as recorded in the parish records).
- Regularly attend the parish's worship.
- Contribute to the parish's financial support for at least the 12 months preceding the Annual Meeting or a special parish meeting.

Eligibility for Offices

- Delegate to Diocesan Convention: Be a Qualified Voter, and on parish rolls for past 12 months.
- Vestry: the above and pledger and giver of record.
- Warden: all of the above plus a confirmed Communicant of the Episcopal Church with at least 3 years' experience on Epiphany's Vestry.

The process allows some time for discernment and to ascertain if the nominees met the requirements for office. If you have questions about the nominations process or are considering being nominated, please contact a member of the Vestry. Many hands and perspectives bring vitality to our parish.

FROM THE



RECTOR



We are approaching the season of Thanksgiving, a season dedicated to expressing thankfulness. During Thanksgiving we give thanks for our family and friends, and we do this through the sharing of a feast of food. We bust out family heirloom recipes, we dust off holiday traditions, we share all the

embarrassing "when you were little" stories. It is a time of connection. And it is meant to fill us deeply with gratitude, so when things get hard, we can look back upon the goodness in our lives.

Christian stewardship too is about sharing and expressing our thankfulness through our time, talents, and treasures with God's church. It is about sharing our faith, a faith that is steeped in God's story of Jesus Christ, a story of love, compassion, and generosity for those in need.

God's story is alive and well in us! I encourage everyone to share their stewardship stories and to encourage others to tell theirs. Generosity in the name of Christ will then continue to ripple; it already is in motion and each one of us is living proof.

When we give, we are ultimately connected to the recipient of that gift in ways more powerful than we might realize. In a study, James Fowler and Nicholas Christakis studied the effects that giving has on the immediate recipient, and on those who come after.* Fowler and Christakis did this by giving participants tokens that represented a certain monetary amount. Through a series of opportunities, participants were invited to share those with others in the experiment - sometimes with strangers, other times with people they knew. The researchers found that people often mimicked the behavior they witnessed, which led to positive behaviors that spread far beyond themselves. Their finding is that generosity spreads by three degrees - from person to person to person to person. In other words, when one person stewards gifts generously, it inspires others in a domino effect. They write, "...each person in a network can influence dozens or even hundreds of people, some of whom he or she does not know and has not met." If this can happen when we observe the generosity of people we do not know, imagine how much more we are influenced by witnessing the generosity of those we do know!

It is a parish-based program with membership open to girls from the ages of 5 to 21 of any race, religion, or nationality.

I then went to the official Girls’ Friendly Society website (<http://www.gfsus.org/>) and found out this: “The Girls’ Friendly Society (GFS) provides ministry to girls in a safe and accepting environment where Christ’s love is evident. GFS-

USA is a community within the Episcopal Church and a member of the World Council of GFS. Through local GFS branches, the GFS-USA Month of Service, and GFS World Projects, we strive to respond to human need by serving others and seek to transform unjust structures of society, particularly for women and children. Our

program is designed to foster positive and productive relationships among all.”

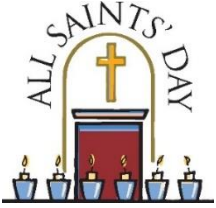

The October Service Ministry project was part of Epiphany's Commitment Sunday celebration. I have included a picture of all the women's and children clothing that were donated to the new Coldwater Center that provides temporary housing for Women and Children. The new center does not take donations directly at the Coldwater Road facility but we can take them to the Open Door Mission center on Plymouth Avenue which runs this new center. At the end of the recent Commitment week, the Service Ministry team organized a Pot Luck Dinner. The free will offering at the dinner totaled \$100 and was donated to the Coldwater Center. It was a great night of good food and good company.



Our November Service Ministry Project is our Annual Meatloaf Dinner at Cameron Ministry Sunday Supper on November 4th. The Sunday dinner is appreciated by the guests at the Cameron House which serves the residents in the Lyell and Otis neighborhood. There are many service opportunities for the members of Epiphany including donating food and paper

products, cooking and serving the guests at Cameron Ministry. Adults and children in grades 6 – 12 are welcome to volunteer for this event.

Later in November, we will be working on two other projects for the Christmas holidays. The first project is the Christmas Bag project through A Meal & More, Inc. which is sponsored by Christ Church in downtown Rochester. They will be making 135 Christmas Bags for many of the guests that are involved in their free meal program. They have requested that we supply 675 packets of hot chocolate so that each bag will have 5 packets of cocoa. It a large GOAL but we can meet the challenge. More information will be posted in mid-November. Our second project will be buying Christmas gifts for a family that is in the RAIHN program. The Christmas tree with ornaments with the requested gifts will be placed in the back of the church in the second half of November. Both projects will be instrumental in helping others enjoy the Christmas holiday.

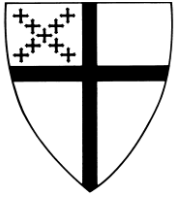
