As I listened to the scriptures and Jimmie Sue's sermon this past Sunday, I wondered if I, through my faith can be as strong as Jesus calls us to be. Oh yes, I can persevere and persist with the best of them, but at what cost. For example, will I become so weary with the struggle that I no longer notice the beautiful foliage as the seasons change before my eyes? Or because the injustice around us is too painful and overwhelming to think about, that I become numb and insensitive?

And then I remembered my friend D, who died just 2 months ago. D, was a nurse for 30 years, one of the best, who raised four children and helped them through their challenges, and fought for years against both breast and ovarian cancer. D was a fighter, but what made D special to her colleagues, friends and family, was her little kindnesses. Through all of her struggles and pain, there was always the birthday card, a gift that she remembered you admiring once upon a time, an invitation to sit on her front porch with a cup of coffee and share the bumps of life, the act of giving meaning to, and respect for, another person's life. I miss my friend D. Mostly I miss her simple acts of kindness. That's something all of us can do while we persist - to remember to give meaning to someone else's life and the same time give meaning to our own.

Call for Nominations

Yes, it is the time of year to prayerfully consider serving Epiphany on the Vestry, as a Warden, or as a Diocesan Convention Delegate. How does one get nominated for an office or nominate a friend or acquaintance for an office?

Two of the objectives of the Nominating Policy are:

- (1) To identify candidates whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at a particular point in its life.
- (2) To provide sufficient time to check and ensure that potential nominees meet canonical and Epiphany's qualifications for the office for which they are

nominated. If not, the policy provides time for them to meet the qualifications.

As you consider who to nominate, please think first of people whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at this time. Then, please remember that all people nominated must meet the qualifications to vote at parish meetings, and eligibility requirements for the office for which they are nominated.

Qualifications to Vote at Parish Meetings

All of the following:

- 18 years old or older.
- Belong to the parish (baptized, confirmed, received or transferred in from an Episcopal Church, as recorded in the parish records).
- Regularly attend the parish's worship.
- Contribute to the parish's financial support for at least the 12 months preceding the Annual Meeting or a special parish meeting.

Eligibility for Offices

- Delegate to Diocesan Convention: Be a Qualified Voter, and on parish rolls for past 12 months.
- Vestry: the above and pledger and giver of record.
- Warden: all of the above plus a confirmed Communicant of the Episcopal Church with at least 3 years' experience, 2 years of which are on Epiphany's Vestry with at least 1 additional year on a Vestry.

If you have questions about the nominations process or are considering being nominated, please contact a member of the Vestry. Many perspectives bring vitality to our parish.

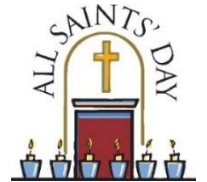

GRANT UPDATE

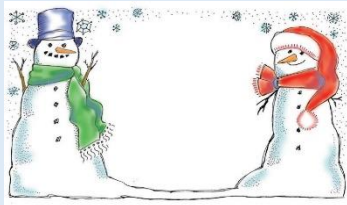

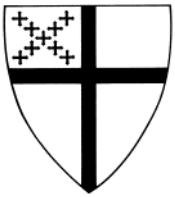
