I AM WALKING PROOF IN THE POWER OF PRAYER-BY LAURIE ZASO

As many of you know On December 24th, 2020, I suffered a major choking incident. That emergency would yield a 10-day struggle on a ventilator, in the ICU of Strong Hospital. Left with a Permanent patch and a stent in my esophagus after suffering from double aspiration Pneumonia. While in their care I required two chest tubes after my lungs partially collapsed. During my struggle, my daughter Katy reached out asking for prayers from all who knew me. Believe me when I say that your prayers were received!

Within days of returning home, my epiphany family was certainly there for me, providing meals, cards, calls, text messages and so many beautiful prayers. I would like to say a sincere thank you to all of you for the tremendous amount of support given during my recovery. It was the most valuable gift I could have received. I am truly humbled by your kindness, many prayers, and your delicious meals. I would like to share a prayer with you that we recited together a weeks ago at our vestry retreat.

Psalm 23 Redux

This I know: My life is in your hands.

Beneath the Whirl of what is, is a deep –down quiet place.



Latest Guidance from the Diocese on Re-Gathering

Dear Parish,

The Diocese has given parishes permission to begin to re-gather following the same metrics and guidelines submitted and approved by each church’s Vestry and the Diocese.

The Vestry and I have made the decision that Epiphany will resume in-person Sunday Worship Services starting on Sunday, April 4th.

We will continue to hold our 9:30am Zoom Sunday Worship Services, and our in-person Worship Services will continue to be at 11am. We must keep wearing our face masks, maintaining 6 feet of physical distancing, use sign-up genius, communion is wafer only, and no singing.

APRIL SERVICE MINISTRY UPDATE

Epiphany is currently finishing up two Service Ministry project that will be ending at the end of March and early April. The Service Ministry team is very grateful to our parishioner for making Easter Food Baskets that will be distributed by the Gates Police department to less fortunate families in the Town of Gates. These food basket will be distributed during Holy Week. A big thank you goes to Birdie Ames for coordinating this project including joining the Town of Gates with the distribution of the Easter Food Baskets.

The fiber ministry project is still ongoing until Easter Sunday. Our goal is to make 40 fiber projects (Blankets, prayer shawls, hat, scarfs, etc) for the 40 days of Lent. Hopefully, we can meet our goal with the many creative, crafty individuals at Epiphany.

Our next project which will start the end of April through mid-May will be a joint project with the Service Ministry team and the youth at Epiphany. We will be making Blessing Bags for SWEM. Blessing Bags contain food items that can be used immediately without the need for cooking or a can opener. Suggested items include juice, fruit or granola bars, fruit cups, crackers packets and others items. Included in the resealable plastic bag will be the nonperishable food and an information flyers about where to obtain assistance for the individual in need. More information will be placed in the bulletin in several weeks and the collection will be from April 25th to May 2nd. The youth will assemble the Blessing bags in early to mid-May.

Why do we make things?

Why do we make things? What have we lost with our increasing isolation from the physical world and the skills that have allowed us to flourish within that world? How do we reconnect with our bodies, the earth, and one another? How does the act of making things change us, help us grow, heal us? These are all spiritual questions, and their answer is also spiritual. Making things is an inherently spiritual activity. It immerses us, whether we are conscious of it or not, in the deepest questions of human life. Like any contemplative practice, craft encourages us to slow down, to connect with our bodies, and to enter a state of timelessness or eternity in which we cease to strive, even as we work for an end. The process of making something, beginning with raw materials, engaging our senses and abilities—and our limitations—and following through until we have a finished piece is itself a spiritual inquiry into the nature of reality and the nature of the self.

Put more straightforwardly, when I make something, I discover more about who I am, which includes a deeper understanding of the world in which I live. That this knowledge is usually intuitive and implicit rather than explicit makes it no less transformative. Craft is also an inherently religious activity. The word “religion” derives from the Latin “religare,” which means “to bind together.” In the same way a physician binds a wound, craft, when engaged in as a contemplative practice, binds the fragments of our many selves into one unified Self.

Vigen Guroian, an Orthodox theologian and gardener, puts it this way: “When I garden, earth and earthworm pass between my fingers, and I realize that I am made of the same stuff. [...] Man is a microcosm in whose flesh resonates and reverberates the pulse of the whole creation, in whose mind creation comes to consciousness, and through whose imagination and will God want to heal and reconcile everything that sin has wounded and put in disharmony.” (Inheriting Paradise, p. 7)

When I knit (or sew, or garden, or pray) I am remade and renewed. I am religione bound back together

again—and made more whole in the process.

Through contemplative crafting, I learn that identity is not something I create. It is something I allow to emerge, seemingly all of a sudden, until a beautiful pattern makes me laugh out loud with joy.

Lent need not be a dreary time. Joy is perfectly wonderful way to pray and prepare!


