CHURCH FAMILY

During the rummage sale this year, I received many kind words from people in our community about how our church is a “family”. Visitors can tell that our church is special and that we all have a special connection. I invited them to join us of course, and I am hoping a few come to check us out!

We are now looking for volunteers to serve on vestry. I am encouraging you to volunteer. By serving you will ensure that Epiphany will continue to be a “church family” serving our community. Serving is a way to give back that’s actually meaningful and shows we’re really thankful.

There are many gifts with which we can serve God and The Church of the Epiphany. Just as Altar Guild prepares the table for the Eucharistic meal and musicians offer their talents, vestry members have gifts for seeing the big picture, balancing competing interests, protecting the assets of our parish, etc. The vestry is like a board of directors for our church.

- The time commitment is minimal. There is a set agenda, we meet for 1-1.5 hours each month. We Zoom during the winter months. Jimmie Sue is very good about sticking to the time, and we usually end at one hour or less.
- Participating in the Vestry Views in the Star and Vestry Contact for the day are on days that you choose.
- You learn and have an impact on how the church works and what Jimmie Sue is doing to ensure Epiphany’s success.
- We meet once a year for a retreat, leadership training and team building.

The main roles of Vestry are:

- Protect the Mission
 - The people of Epiphany gather to nurture Christ within, in-order to serve Christ in All.
- Insure the Values of our church
 - What are the means and programs by which we are working toward our Vision? Small Groups, Meals from the Heart, Funeral Reception Ministry, WOE, MOE, Rummage Sale, Stewardship, Garden Group, Widow’s Group etc.
- Uphold Financial Integrity
 - The treasurer reviews the finances on a monthly basis with the vestry.
- Support the Rector
 - The vestry assists Jimmie Sue to lead the parish in all of the (above). We have open and honest discussions without confrontation. We all respect each other and the commitment we have made. --Kim Hyde

Serving on Vestry – Epiphany Needs You!!



CALLED TO SERVE

Dear Parish,

Serving on Vestry is a big deal, a Vestry is a vital function of the parish. Without a full Vestry we can’t approve budgets, we can’t approve repairs or parish needs that are over \$250.00. We can’t

approve Salaries for our Staff and Rector. Without a full Vestry we can’t do the visioning work and missional work that guides the parish.

A sign of parish health and vitality is having people who are willing to serve as parish leaders on the Vestry. I know that some of you have heard how Vestry Meetings went prior to my arrival. That is not how Vestry Meetings work now. We are a good group that works very well together.

If we have differing views we listen to one another respectfully and come to a consensus together that we can all support. We have an Agenda that we stick too, we start on time (we begin at 7pm) and often end our meetings on time or early (usually between 8pm and 8:30pm).

We use our Vestry Retreat in February as a time to get to know each other as a leadership body, and to think about what is needed to guide and grow the parish. Also, our Vestry meetings are also hybrid now, meaning we meet from November – March we meet via Zoom, and from April – October in-person at church. We meet monthly except for in July, and we hold Special Vestry meetings only when absolutely necessary.

At this time, we have 3 open Vestry Member positions. A term is 3 years in length with an option to serve for a second 3 year term at the completion of your first term.

You can talk to prior Vestry Members, current Vestry Members, our Wardens, (and me too) to ask questions about what it’s like to serve on Vestry.

If you are interested in serving on the Vestry please let me or a Vestry Member or the Wardens know.

Call for Nominations

Yes, it is the time of year to prayerfully consider serving Epiphany on the Vestry, as a Warden, or as a Diocesan Convention Delegate. How does one get nominated for an office or nominate a friend or acquaintance for an office?

Two of the objectives of the Nominating Policy are:

- (1) To identify candidates whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at a particular point in its life.
- (2) To provide sufficient time to check and ensure that potential nominees meet canonical and Epiphany's qualifications for the office for which they are nominated. If not, the policy provides time for them to meet the qualifications.

As you consider who to nominate, please think first of people whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at this time. Then, please remember that all people nominated must meet the qualifications to vote at parish meetings, and eligibility requirements for the office for which they are nominated.

Qualifications to Vote at Parish Meetings

All of the following:

- 18 years old or older.
- Belong to the parish (baptized, confirmed, received or transferred in from an Episcopal Church, as recorded in the parish records).
- Regularly attend the parish's worship.
- Contribute to the parish's financial support for at least the 12 months preceding the Annual Meeting or a special parish meeting.

Eligibility for Offices

- Delegate to Diocesan Convention: Be a Qualified Voter, and on parish rolls for past 12 months.
- Vestry: the above and pledger and giver of record.
- Warden: all of the above plus a confirmed Communicant of the Episcopal Church with at least 3 years' experience, 2 years of which are on Epiphany's Vestry with at least 1 additional year on a Vestry.

If you have questions about the nominations process or are considering being nominated, please

contact a member of the Vestry. Many perspectives bring vitality to our parish.

Not long before Covid, we had a fun and informative presentation on a Wednesday evening by a couple of folks from Wines by Design. They have survived Covid, have moved (they are across the street from Epiphany now!) and are accepting groups for winemaking. 
Dear Parish,



Update on Bishop Singh

Dear Parish,

Some of you may have seen the email announcement from our Bishop's office. Bishop Singh made public his intention to resign as Diocesan Bishop effective February 2, 2022. His decision comes after much prayerful thought and discernment with his family, friends, trusted colleagues, and the Presiding Bishop. This was his decision and he made his intention known to the Standing Committee over the summer and work began for the leadership transition.

At Diocesan Convention in October, we will elect a Bishop Provisional who will lead the diocese during the interim. A standard practice, she or he is someone who is already a bishop, whether active or retired, and will take on the responsibility of visitations and other episcopal ministries. In the coming months, the Standing Committee, will announce the process for electing a new Bishop Diocesan.

Until then, we will continue to celebrate Bishop Singh's ministry in our midst.




