VESTRY VIEWS

The Healing Power of Faith and Prayer

There are many benefits of having faith in God and praying. Praying connects us with God and opens us up to all of the great things that can happen from that relationship. Studies have shown that we are healthier and happier when we are grounded in the love of God. Praying for others can also open up our hearts to feel compassion and empathy.

Prayer and meditation are highly effective in lowering our stress level and reactivity to traumatic and negative events. Research has shown that praying impacts several areas of the brain involved in self reflection and self soothing. Pictures from magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) shows that when areas of thoughtful reflection are activated, other parts of the brain, associated with taking action, are inactivated. This inverse correlation can help us to understand how prayer can assist people struggling with negative thoughts, like addictive urges and behaviors. MRI studies have confirmed that when addicts are shown drug related images to stimulate cravings, these were reduced when the participants prayed. Praying caused changes in the areas of the brain that control emotion and thoughtful responses, so someone is less likely to act on impulse. This gives people time to utilize healthier coping strategies.

Prayer and meditation are highly effective in lowering our reactions to traumatic and negative events. During times of stress our central nervous system becomes over stimulated and hyperactive and this can cause us to go into survival mode, where we may freeze, fight, or flee a stressful situation. This can decrease the functioning of the frontal lobe and can prevent us from thinking things through clearly. This is why when we are stressed out we can make poor decisions and may act in more negative and self-destructive ways.

There is research showing that meditation and prayer can trigger the release of "feel good chemicals" like serotonin and dopamine, in the brain. Prayer can also activate neural pathways, that we developed when young, to release hormones such as oxytocin, which is known for its role in maternal labor, lactation, and creating a desire to bond with others. Oxytocin also increases feelings of trust and attachment with God and this makes us feel hopeful in times of fear and uncertainty.

Taking time for prayer and meditation allows us to regain our balance and perspective and to go on to take positive steps in our lives. Prayer is one of the greatest gifts from God and is available to us anytime. So when life is feeling like it is too much to manage, just take some to time to pray to regain the balance and perspective needed to go out and take positive steps to live our most fulfilling lives.

Vestry Highlights OCTOBER 18, 2022

Business:

- Vestry Meeting Minutes: M-S-A to approve the Vestry Meeting Minutes for Tuesday, September 20, 2022
- Treasurer's Report: Deb discussed the need to meet in person at our November 15, 2022 meeting, as the bank signature changes were not completed by the bank properly (even though everyone signed in January). We need to complete the process.
- Share:
- The Rev. Virginia Tyler Smith was our guest and spoke about the Transition process. She asked all present what their thoughts and concerns were re' the future of Epiphany as we move forward in our search for a new Rector. Some of the thoughts/concerns mentioned were:

- o Will we close; what would happen to the columbarium if we closed
- Will it be necessary to only have one service
- o Are there any Deacons available
- We will get through it, we've done it before
- We have a strong Vestry
- o People will have to step up to the plate to lend a hand, as necessary
- Who can be on the Search Committee
- People will need to compromise

A lengthy discussion followed. Virginia answered some of our concerns and shared valuable information re' the transition process and the Search Committee. The Vestry will ask for qualified volunteers to serve and will choose 5-7 members for the committee at a Zoom meeting on November 2, 2022. The Diocese is much more involved in the process than in the past, which will make it easier for the Search Committee.

- The Wardens reported that we have Clergy coverage for Sundays and Holidays through March, 2023. Thank you, Margaret!
- The Vestry unanimously voted to forgo the church service Sunday, December 25, 2022 due to very low attendance in past years. There will be Morning Prayer on Sunday, January 1, 2023 at 8:00 and 10:00 a.m.

Service Ministry November Update

The Service Ministry team is busy finishing up the October Service Ministry project to donate money to the Christian Appalachian Project for the Kentucky flood victims. The free-will donation Pot Luck dinner on October 1st was very successful in raising \$172 dollars but was also was a wonderful evening of good food and fellowship. We are asking parishioner to donate their can and bottle deposits until the end of October and we have not finalized the donation totals at this time. We are confident that the parish will have a sizable donation to help Kentucky Flood victims and the Service Ministry team will update parishioners once the final donation numbers are tallied.

Our next Service Ministry project will be from October 30 -November 13th and will benefit the Junior League of Rochester Diaper Bank. More than 1 in 3 families in the US suffers from diaper need and with Rochester's extreme poverty rates that number may be even higher. We will be collecting diapers, baby wipes and diaper creams to be used by many organizations and social workers in Monroe County since there is no government assistance available for diapers and other necessities. Please look at the bulletin for more details.

Our Christmas holiday projects will be very familiar to the parish. We will sponsor a family at Family Promise of Greater of Rochester (RAIHN) to provide Christmas gifts for our chosen family. We will also be

involved in the Christmas Bag Project which is sponsored by "A Meal & More, Inc." at Christ Church in downtown Rochester. We will be providing hot chocolate packets and individual size facial tissue packets again this year. More details will be forthcoming.

Call for Nominations

Yes, it is the time of year to prayerfully consider serving Epiphany on the Vestry, as a Warden, or as a Diocesan Convention Delegate. How does one get nominated for an office or nominate a friend or acquaintance for an office?

Two of the objectives of the Nominating Policy are:

- (1) To identify candidates whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at a particular point in its life.
- (2) To provide sufficient time to check and ensure that potential nominees meet canonical and Epiphany's qualifications for the office for which they are nominated. If not, the policy provides time for them to meet the qualifications.

As you consider who to nominate, please think first of people whose unique strengths and gifts are most needed by the parish at this time. Then, please remember that all people nominated must meet the qualifications to vote at parish meetings, and eligibility requirements for the office for which they are nominated.

Qualifications to Vote at Parish Meetings

All of the following:

- 18 years old or older.
- Belong to the parish (baptized, confirmed, received or transferred in from an Episcopal Church, as recorded in the parish records).
- Regularly attend the parish's worship.
- Contribute to the parish's financial support for at least the 12 months preceding the Annual Meeting or a special parish meeting.

Eligibility for Offices

- Delegate to Diocesan Convention: Be a Qualified Voter, and on parish rolls for past 12 months.
- Vestry: the above and pledger and giver of record.
- <u>Warden</u>: all of the above plus a confirmed Communicant of the Episcopal Church with at least 3 years' experience, 2 years of which are on Epiphany's Vestry with at least 1 additional year on a Vestry.

If you have questions about the nominations process or are considering being nominated, please contact a member of the Vestry. Many perspectives bring vitality to our parish.
