Mutual Aid in Rochester

One way Epiphany has been actively helping our community is through our food stand, located in the parking lot. We appreciate the many donations the parish has made, as well as the parishioners who keep it organized and stocked. It is emptied quickly, as food costs increase and community need grows.

The motto for this food stand is "give what you can, take what you need." This box is part of a larger network of support called Rochester Mutual Aid Network and Roc Food Not Bombs. Created as a crisis response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the network seeks to "help the community sustain itself" by "connecting those in need of aid with those who can offer it." Roc Food Not Bombs lists 44 different food stands in Rochester, including Epiphany's.

The idea of mutual aid encompasses so much of what we do as a parish. We give what we are able to help those less fortunate. As we approach the holiday season, I challenge you to think deeper about the systemic issues that lead to such a high need in our community. These include poverty, homelessness gentrification, food insecurity, food deserts and racial injustice.

I am proud that Epiphany supports mutual aid in our community and feel thankful for the giving spirit of our parish. May we continue to keep those in need in our hearts and minds beyond the holiday season.

Our Christmas holiday service projects were very successful this year due to the generosity of our parishioners. We sponsored a family at Family Promise of Greater of Rochester (RAIHN) and provided Christmas gifts for our chosen family. All the gifts requested were purchased, wrapped with the gift tag attached. Epiphany's generosity has helped a family have a very special Christmas

We were also involved in the Christmas Bag Project which is sponsored by "A Meal & More, Inc." at Christ Church in downtown Rochester. We provided 662 hot chocolate packets and 285 individual size facial tissue packets for 135 clients in this program. Epiphany exceeded our goal by 180%.

<u>Vestry Nominee – Patty Sharkey</u>

My name is Patricia L. Sharkey and I am very happy to have found a parish at The Church of the Epiphany. Everyone has been so warm and supportive and the services have been both meaningful and engaging. I am eager to support the church and one of the ways I could do so would be to continue to (I just completed a one year appointment) serve as a member of the Vestry. I would be happy to continue to serve in this way. I am a registered nurse who started out working on an acute psychiatric unit for years. I went on to earn a Masters of Science Degree at SUNY Buffalo, specializing in Mental Health/ Psychiatric Nursing. I then worked at the SUNY at Brockport as a nursing professor for the next 38 years and also maintained a clinical practice at the Chemical Dependency Unit at Unity Hospital and as a consultant /educator to inpatient psychiatric units. At Brockport, I taught nursing students, in both the classroom and clinical settings, how to effectively care for the mentally ill and those struggling with alcohol and other drug addictions. I was so fortunate to be able to influence new generations of nurses to care for people with compassion, kindness, and empathy. To continue supporting students, I established a scholarship to be awarded annually to a deserving nursing student. I have also specialized in geriatric psychiatry and for many years I served as a consultant to numerous nursing homes and spent 18 years seeing patients at the Episcopal Church Home. I really enjoyed finding ways to improve the quality of life for seniors who were suffering from emotional and behavioral issues. It has been a very rewarding and challenging career and I am now looking for ways to serve others. I am very interested in helping out at The Church of the Epiphany and would like to continue to be a member of the Vestry, where I think my life experiences could be helpful. Vestry Nominee – Mike Grasso

My name is Mike Grasso and I have been with Epiphany since 9/15/1979 which is when I married Debbie. For several years after, we were in and out of the church as we moved from place to place. Currently I am an active member of Epiphany. I have served as a past member of the vestry and am currently serving as the Pledge Clerk to date. Just to clear up any confusion about this role, I am the character that generates the donation statements that you all receive for your taxes at the end of the year. Over the years I have also had a hand in the physical running of Epiphany by helping with mowing, sink replacements, moving stuff, and cutting down trees, etc.. I will stress that none of this was done by me alone, plenty of help and input was provided from those, who did in many cases, most of the work as well.

<u>Vestry Nominee – Nick Parisi</u>

My name is Nick Parisi and I would like to be considered for a one-year term for Epiphany's Vestry. After a 48-year career with H&R Block, including 25 years as a District Manager and 11 years as a Franchisee, I have finally decided to fully retire.

My wife, Margaret, and I have been members of Epiphany for approximately 18 years. During this time, I've been involved in many activities with the Church.

I was the Church Treasurer for seven years which has given me great insight to the Church's finances. I am currently serving on the Finance committee, helping to develop our annual budget and looking into other financial issues. I was a member of the committee that helped secure the Congregational Development Grant from the Diocese. I served on the Search Committee that brought Rev. Jimmie Sue to Epiphany.

I've been a "Lawn Rangers" for approximately 10 years, helping to maintain the Church grounds. I've also been a member of the Church choir for 12 years.

I believe Epiphany is at a crossroads now in search of a new Rector. Decisions that need to be made in the next several months will be critical to our long-term viability. I believe my business experience can be valuable to the Vestry and I want to continue to support the Church.

Clerk for Vestry – Pat Lesher

My name is Pat Lesher. I have been asked to be Clerk of the Vestry for 2023, which I have accepted. My husband, Bill and I have been members of Epiphany for over 50 years. During these years I have been Clerk of the Vestry and have served as Vestryperson twice. For 25 years I was treasurer of WOE. Also was a Counter for 25 years. Currently, I'm a greeter/usher and a member of the Welcome committee, one of Epiphany's small groups.

Warden Candidate - Don Metzinger

My family and I have been coming to Epiphany for about 25 years. Pam, Adam, Cassie and I are all active in the church. Pam sings in the Choir, runs the WOE rummage sale, does coffee hour, does alter guild, does music for the Sunday services and a host of other things. Adam is an Acolyte and does some training for the younger Acolytes. Cassie is a Sunday School teacher and is part of the Adult Formation group.

I am the the Sunday School superintendent / J2A coordinator. I am a Vestry member, part of the Youth group committee, a Eucharistic minister and help out on a variety of other tasks around the church.

I currently own a franchise called 1-800 Water Damage of Rochester NY. We do water remediation and Flood work along with sewage cleanup, Fire and Smoke cleanup and Mold remediation. There are over a hundred 1-800 Water Damage franchises in the US. Our franchise is new to the Rochester area. In fact we are the only 1-800 Water Damage franchise in Western NY. We opened up in July and are working to grow in this area. Marketing is not one of my strengths, so if anyone is good with marketing, I would love some help.

I served on the Finance Committee, Personnel Practices Committees, Adult Formation Small Group, and the Grant Team. When my kids were younger I was a Church School Teacher and Church School superintendent. I previously served on Vestry and spent four years as a Warden. I completed the two week long College of Congregational Development (CCD), a church leadership training program offered by the Episcopal Diocese.


