Business:

1. Approve the Tuesday, February 21, 2023 Vestry Meeting Minutes: M-S-A to approve the February 21, Vestry Meeting Minutes.

2. Finance Report: Deb reported \$1200 Sarah Jones Fund sent to us from the Diocese. Also, received an extra gift this month from the Diocese of \$500. Will put both in the non-operating account for now. Nick inquired if we had received a bill for snow plowing this year. In the past we have used SJ Fund to pay this bill. Last year we took money out of this Fund for furnace, then paid that money back to fund. SJ Fund not designated for anything this year. Deb submitted February Treasurer's report for review. M-S-A to accept February 2023 Treasurer's Report,

3. Parochial Report: Deb will submit Parochial Report to Diocese.

M-S-A to accept 2022 Diocesan Parochial Report. Deb was informed by Kathy at Diocese, Epiphany will not do the audit themselves because of Jimmie Sue leaving in 2022. Someone from the Diocese will come in September. Prior to that, they will notify the Treasurer what needs to be ready for them. Next year Epiphany will do audit themselves.

4. Shredding old documents securely: Kristen informed the Vestry that the Kiwanis will not be doing the shredding process this year. Deb had previously checked with Classified Scanning on Paul Rd. for their pricing. \$15/box. She anticipates there will be 2 boxes. She would like to to get this done as soon as possible. Nick offered to help to locate and box other documents that should be shredded. Lisa stated that any documents kept that are older than 7 years may be auditable.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Mike reported on what led up to discussion and change of furnace filters. It was quite cold in the Church this Winter. The Furnace Room was too hot; it was decided to leave the door opened. At that time the furnace filters were checked. Merve 13, hospital grade filters were being used. Sometime last year someone made a decision (possibly

because of COVID) to buy hospital grade filters, but didn't realize it could impact the air flow and heating circulation. In January and February we used more gas because of these filters. With this information, we switched to Merve 8 filters, which improved the air flow and heat circulation in the Church. After much discussion, it was suggested we have Boccacino Heating which services are York furnace check to see if Merve 8 filters are what we should be using. Mike will call Boccacino Heating to set up an appointment.

2. An organ speaker in the church has been replaced with a new one. Also the fabric, which is badly deteriorated on the 2 large speakers in front of the church is being replaced. Bruce Pillman, Dave Pulhamas and Mike Grasso are doing the work. WOE from Rummage Sale proceeds funded

\$800 for the new speaker and approx \$300 for speaker fabric. A thank you note will be sent to WOE. For the future, we should be aware of things that need to be looked at pertaining to the organ. If anything needs to be addressed, we should have money set aside for projects.

Another concern is the organ itself. It was moved off to the side a while ago. It was suggested to move it back. The organ itself is having problems and leaving it in place for now is the best. Our repairman has moved to Jamestown. We know there will be more problems down the road. When Grace Plouffe passed, she donated money to set up an organ fund. Since replacement of the organ is a concern, Deb will check to see if an organ fund was set up. A suggestion was made to check with Episcopal churches that have closed to see if they have an organ for sale.

SMALL GROUPS UPDATE: The Adult Formation group with the help of Deb Grasso will host an Alzheimer's program on Wednesday, March 22, 2023.

They will be able to use the t.v. although the remote isn't working. Don put out that currently, there are 5 small groups, should we be adding another or just forming a fund raising group. With Jimmie Sue leaving nothing has been going on with existing groups. Could Vestry members that are in a small group check on their group about not going too long without meeting and having projects. Discussion with their group what's working and what's not. What you would involve or change in small group to go forward. More discussion about small groups at April Vestry meeting. Kim discussed that she is inputting more info into our web site, updating calendar and events, linking Epiphany's Facebook page to our website. Having it all current for prospective priests to look at.

A discussion involving our need for an updated cable, wifi and telephone system ensued. The original set-up with Frontier was just a phone system, then wifi added but phone wire no real cable, The system with Frontier has lousy reception for our Facebook live in the church. Also, people volunteering to record are using their own minutes. This at a cost of \$179/month. Epiphany needs a complete business system that moves us into the 21st century. Don will check with Frontier to see if there is an updated business type system. Mike has been in touch with Spectrum about cable and wifi. It appears the only access outside the church is across the street . Spectrum would have to lay cable at a cost of \$11,700 where they would pay \$8000, Epiphany's share would be \$3700(this is with 300 mg download). Once this has been done, the monthly cost would be significantly less than we are presently paying Frontier. This issue really needs to be addressed in the near future.

Nick reported that he, Dave and Jack have set 8/6/2023 at Pinewood for the annual golf outing. Committee will encourage a better show of attendance from the Church. Ann Silver's family continues to be very supportive of tournament

Service Ministry April Update

Epiphany has been very busy with four Service Ministry projects during Lent. Our first project was providing a meal and donations of personal hygiene products for the residents of the Eagle Star Transitional Housing for Veterans in Spencerport on March 9th. The guests were very appreciative of the meal and enjoyed socializing with our volunteers. A BIG thank you to everyone who helped with the project which included providing a delicious meal, serving and socializing with the guests and donation of hygiene products

The Youth of Epiphany made activity bags on March 12th for Golisano's Children hospital. The activity bags are for children who are hospitalized or waiting for care in the Emergency Department. The youth assembled over 100 activity bags which have been delivered to the hospital. The Child Life department was WOWED by the generosity and hard work by the Youth of Epiphany.

One of our two remaining Lent projects that will be completed on Easter Sunday is our Fiber Ministry project. We are collecting creative items to provide warmth and comfort to others. Our goal is 40 items for the 40 days of Lent. We will update the parishioners with the final count of fiber projects after the collection is completed on Easter Sunday.

Our last Lent project is providing Easter Food Baskets for some Gates families in need. We will be collecting the food baskets until April 2nd and the Gates Police department will help us deliver the food baskets to Gates residents by Easter Sunday. Currently, we have 22 Easter Food Baskets

Plans are underway for the Church of Epiphany to adopt Family Promise of Greater Rochester (FPGROC, formerly RAIHN) for the month of May. FPGROC assists families at risk of or experiencing homelessness to achieve independence in collaboration with the greater community. The Service Ministry team is working on providing an education session for Epiphany on homelessness, working on a service project at the Day Center for FPGROC, collecting needed items for the operation of the Day Center and providing some special treats for the guests and staff of FPGROC. More details will be coming soon.

The Service Ministry team will be planning additional projects for later this spring and summe. Please feel free to contact any member on the Service Ministry team if you have any suggestions for projects or would like to join our team. We appreciate all the support from the parishioners at Epiphany.

Rector Search Committee Search Committee April Update

The search process is now transitioning to Phase II, which means that the open rector position has been posted. This first posting of the rector position will continue until April 30th and renewed as necessary. The open position is posted in four locations: the local Rochester Diocese website, the national Episcopal Newsletter, Office of Transitional Ministry and at the Regional Transitional Ministry Conference.

Virginia Tyler- Smith, the Transitional Dean for our diocese, has recently attended the Regional Transitional Ministry Conference in North Carolina which was held the week of March 12th. During the conference, she met with other transitional deans from the East and Mid-west and is actively recruiting for our open rector position.

In preparation for the interview process, the Search Committee will continue to update our Church's social media sites. This will include the Church's website, Facebook and Instagram pages. The team will prepare interview questions and conduct mock interviews, so that we are prepared when candidates are identified and vetted by the diocese to be considered for Epiphany's rector position.

Parish Scholarships

Thanks to the generosity of the families and friends of the Rev'd John VanBrederode and Karen Marr, we are fortunate to have two funds which provide assistance for post-secondary education. The deadline for both is **Sunday, May 7th.**

How are recipients chosen? The Scholarship Committee meets and reviews all applications. It may, at its discretion, interview the applicants.

Who serves on the Committee? A member of the Vestry, a representative from the Church School or J2A program, a representative from one of the parish's Teams or Committees, and an "at-large" parishioner.

Notification: The Committee will notify each applicant of its decision in writing by June 4th. Recipients will be announced on a Sunday in June, at the 10:00 a.m. service.

John VanBrederode - Memorial Scholarship

Eligible applicants:

- * Graduating High school seniors
- * have been active in the life of Epiphany
- * will continue their studies in college or trade school

Karen Marr - Memorial Award

Eligible applicants must:

- * have "special need." Special need can be a physical or learning disability.
- * have completed one year of post-high school education. Continuing education can be college or trade school.
- * be a confirmed member of The Church of the Epiphany for at least one year.

Note: The Marr Award is available 3 times per year. Application deadlines are May 1st, August 1st and December 1st.
