Vestry Highlights
FEBRUARY 21, 2023

#### **Business:**

- 1, Approve the Tuesday, January, 17, 2023 Vestry Meeting Minutes: M-S-A to approve the January 17, Vestry Meeting Minutes.
- 2. Finance Report: Deb reported the utilities were higher in Jan (\$500) and February(\$900 est). She recommended the meters be read every month and reported Copier expense higher because of Annual Report and ran out of staples. Suggestion from Nick filter for new furnace, not to continue using hospital grade(which we haven't used in the past). Move down to #8 or #13 filter run less for/possible cost saving. M-S-A to accept the January 2023 Treasurer's Report.
- 3. Check Signer Discussion for 2023: Jack will prepare letter with Wardens, current Vestry members, Treasurer and Clerk of the Vestry who are approved and authorized by the Vestry of the Church of Epiphany to sign checks. Newly elected members will have to go to Key Bank to sign Signature Cards. Since we require two signatures on the checks, with all Vestry members there will always be someone available if a check has to be signed between services(i.e. to pay supply priest).
- 4. Shredding old documents securely: Deb said there are many documents in files located in Choir Room that are over 7 years old and need to be shredded. She will be be looking into other storage of documents that are older than 7 years to be shredded too. She would like to have this process finished before we have a new rector. She has a called shredding business(Shred It) \$100. to rent one; is looking into it and other options. Nick said when he closed his business down, his bank offered a free shredding service. Maybe, we could approach Key Bank to see if this service is available. Kristen offered that Kiwanis is hosting a shredding day in May, \$10. a car; she will gather more info. Follow-up on aforementioned shredding options will be finalized at next Vestry meeting.

- 1. Signing up for Vestry Contact on Sundays, Vestry Views for STAR, Prayer leader @ Vestry Meeting Through the magic of ZOOM Margaret provided the above listed schedules which Vestry members gave their appropriate info for Margaret to fill in the spreadsheet. These schedules will be e-mailed to each Vestry member.
- 2. Sign up to help when Paddy is Presiding pick him up and take him home

Again, through the magic of ZOOM Margaret provided a schedule for Clergy Coverage which included dates when Paddy would preside and Vestry members signed up to pick him up and take him home. This schedule will be mailed to each Vestry member. We have Supply Clergy Coverage through August 27, 2023

- 3. As discussed under Welcome New Vestry Members questions, the March meeting will be via ZOOM.
- 4. Search Committee discussion and feedback. The Search Committee had meetings open to parishioners after 8 a.m. and 10a.m. services February 12. Committee open to feedback, comments, discussed return of surveys(received 50 so far). Feb 19, again Search committee available for any questions. Deb, Jack and Don completed 2022 Parochial Report which is now in the system. Based on Parochial Report from 2021 and 2022 Epiphany has had an average attendance that changed from 52 to 57, beneficial input to include in Search Committee report. They have collected pertinent information to be given in written form to Virginia, our Diocesan contact. Committee is doing an awesome job.

SMALL GROUPS UPDATE: Small groups haven't met recently. Hopefully, Small groups will become active soon.

#### **Service Ministry March Update**

Service Ministry started 2023 with our annual "Souper Bowl "collection of soups, chili's and canned/boxed pasta which was donated to St. Theodore's Food Pantry. The collection ended on Super Bowl Sunday (February 12<sup>th</sup>). Our goal was 300 CANS and we collected **335 cans.** A big thank you to Nancy and Steve Mancini for delivering the donations to St. Theodore's. **Team Epiphany is amazing!!!** 

The Lent/Easter season will include four Service Ministry projects. Our first project is to provide a dinner for the veterans who are currently residing at Eagle Star Transitional House in Spencerport on Thursday, March 9th. We will be bringing dinner and serving up to 15 residents. In addition to the dinner, we will be collecting personal hygiene products (shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, etc.) for the residents. The sign-up sheet and collection bin is located in the main hallway.

The second Lenten project is our Fiber Ministry project. We are requesting creative items to provide warmth and comfort to others. Suggested items include blankets, quilts, shawls, hats, and mittens. Get your creative juices flowing and help us reach the goal of 40 items for the 40 days of Lent. The collection will take place from February 22nd- April 9<sup>th.</sup> The collection baskets will be in the main hallway in church.

Our third project will be working with the Town of Gates to provide Easter Food Baskets for some Gates families in need. Information about the food items and gift card for the Easter Food baskets will be posted in early March. The collection will be from 3/12-4/2/23. The Gates Police department will help us distribute the food baskets.

The youth of Epiphany will be working on the forth Lenten service project. They will be making activity bags for Golisano's Children hospital for patients when they are either hospitalized or waiting for care in the Emergency Department. The youth will be assembling the activity bags on March 12<sup>th</sup> after church.

The Service Ministry team will be planning additional projects for later this spring and summer. Please feel free to contact any member on the Service Ministry team if you have any suggestions for projects or would like to join our team. We appreciate all the support from the parishioners at Epiphany.

# **Rector Search Committee**

#### **Search Committee Update**

The Search Committee continues to work with the Very Rev. Virginia Tyler Smith, who is the Dean of Transitions for the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester. The search team has been meeting on a regular basis and is working on the seven phases of the rector search process.

The Search team is very grateful for the tremendous response of our parishioners in answering the two surveys that were sent and participation in one the three open forums. The team received 59 responses from the first survey and 56 responses from the second survey. We had 31 individuals attend one of the three open forums. All of your input is valuable as we prepare our documentation to move forward with the rector search.

The Search committee is now transitioning from Phase 1 which is gathering data to Phase 2 which is writing up the required materials needed before the rector position can be posted. The current timeline is that written materials will be submitted to Rev Virginia Tyler-smith by February 23<sup>rd</sup> so that she can begin posting the position before she attends the Transitional Ministry Conference in early March. Epiphany's open rector position will be posted in four locations which include the Office of Transitional Ministry, the Transitional Ministry Conference, the Episcopal News Services newsletter and locally on the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester website.

The search team will now focus on summarizing the survey results so that the parishioners can review and to update Epiphany's website and parish profile. We are now requesting photos from parishioners to help us update the church website. Anyone willing to share their photos can e-mail them to <a href="mailto:coeoffice@frontier.com">coeoffice@frontier.com</a>. We are looking for photos of our church services, Sunday school program, committee work and social events.

The Search team will continue provide updates on a regular basis for all information that is not considered confidential. (Such as the names of various candidates applying for the open rector position.) The Search committee has a bulletin board located in the main hallway which outlines the phases of the search process and highlights where we are in that process. Other communication strategies include written updates in the STAR, E-blasts, bulletin and verbal communication during announcements at our church services. We encourage parishioners to discuss their thoughts and questions concerning the process with anyone on the Search Committee.
