Vestry Highlights
APRIL 18, 2023

Business:

- 1. The Tuesday, March 21, 2023 Vestry Meeting Minutes approved after a correction to add Bob Renehan's name to the Golf Committee . M-S-A to approved the March 21, Vestry Meeting Minutes
- 2. Finance Report: Deb reported the budget is on target as are the pledges. Expenses a little over budget(utlities). Not in a deficit as of 3/31/23. M-S-A to accept March 2023 Treasurer's Report.
- 3. Shredding of old documents: There isn't an update.
- 4. Pastoral Care: Gladys and Birdie, representing the committee gave an update of the issues the committee is facing. As of now they're the only 2 visiting shut-ins and taking them communion. Because of Covid there hasn't been any visits by the Rector to hospital or homes. When a parishioner was dying, there wasn't priest available for them or their family. The spiritual needs of parishioners who are homebound or ill is not being addressed. Also, the directory within the Church office needs to be updated with people who have died, left the church, or changed addresses. Jack and Don will contact Virginia to inquire if 2 priests could be on call for emergency situations at Epiphany. They will look into updating parishioner's list in the Church office
- 5. Internet Update/Spectrum. Mike presented Scope of Work/Spectrum proposal for installation of coaxial cable and 2 twisted wire lines, 300 MB service at a cost of \$11.652.91 with Epiphany's share being \$3,652.91 plus \$95 installation fee. Presently, we have Frontier. 2 phone lines, 3 MB internet/\$193.61/mo.. After much discussion, i.e. we are a business and require a 21st century system, buying routers and new phones, having the internet capabilities for our facebook presence, once cable is installed(we own it) it was decided to use money, approximately \$5000 from the Seabury Woods fund with Diocesan permission to install the Spectrum cable and

phone lines. Since this is a capital improvement to the Church it qualifies for a withdrawal from the Seabury Fund. The extra \$1300 would cover new phones, routers and any other expenses involved in setting up the system. M-S-A to withdraw up to \$5,000 from Seabury Fund for installation of Spectrum Cable and Internet.

- 6. Fans in the church: 4 fans in Church should be upgraded, Tabled for now.
- 7. Mower Storage: Since there were mice nests in the mowers which were stored in old barn, they will be moved to the pole barn for Winter storage.
- 8. Clean out pole barn: There is Pride stuff that needs to be cleaned out. Kristen will take pictures and contact organizations to see if there is interest in taking it. Need to keep like items consolidated and more organized. Will get a team together to take care of this.
- 9. Vestry Pins: Don handed out pins to Vestry people that didn't have one. He reminded them when they go off Vestry to return them.
- 10. Seabury Key and update relationship: Maureen was accidentally locked out of Church. Went to Seabury Woods get a key or call someone. Seabury is supposed to have a key to the Church, but they couldn't find it because they have several unmarked keys on a ring. Don will make sure they have key to Epiphany labeled as such and ask that they keep it in an accessible place, possibly the office. Also, Epiphany is the place they would go if they had to evacuate their facility. Initially, we had someone on the Board of Directors at Seabury. We had an ongoing relationship with the residents via the youth group, shared picnics and other activities. Since we don't have anyone on the Board, our relationship has suffered. Don will try to revive our relationship with Seabury.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

- 1. St. Stephens: St. Stephens closed in February. Virginia/Diocese initiated a Zoom meeting with priests from St. Peters, Avon, Ascension on Lake Ave., Epiphany(w/o priest) and visitors from St. Stephens to inform them what they had to offer at their respective parishes.
- 2. Organ speakers update/St. Stephens: Dave, Mike and Bruce have to set a time to replace the fabric on speakers. Haven't talked to Diocese about St. Stephen's organ.
- 3. Zoom Update/for Search: Zoom meeting created by Virginia/Diocese for Search Committee to conduct mock interviews with Rector candidates.
- 4. Update church policies: Last done 7 years ago. Put aside for a while.
- 5. Church sexual harassment policy update: Kathie to look at updating of the policy. There is on line course for anyone working with youth if they haven't taken it.

SMALL GROUP UPDATES; Cassie and Emily are updating Instagram and Facebook, I Please let them know if you are doing an event Kim trying to update our website but unable to reach or get a call back.

Columbarium plaques should be up to date. Columbarium Comm. will be contacted to check on updating plaques. Tabled for now

Service Ministry May Update

Epiphany has a lot of creative, talented parishioners and we have outdone ourselves with making **109** Fiber Ministry projects. Our Goal was 40 items for the 40 days of Lent and we surpassed that goal by 270%. The fiber projects were blessed at our church services on April 16th. All of these fiber project will bring warmth and comfort to the individuals that receive them. The fiber ministry projects are being distributed to Golisano Children's hospital including the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit, Meals on Wheels, Aurora House, Fostering Hope and will replenish our fiber ministry collections of shawls and blankets to be given out to anyone in need. Anyone in the parish may take a fiber ministry project which are located in the Auxiliary Room closet for a family member or friend in need.

The Church of Epiphany is adopting Family Promise of Greater Rochester (FPGROC, formerly RAIHN) for the month of May. FPGROC assists families at risk of or experiencing homelessness to achieve independence in collaboration with the greater community. The Service Ministry team is hosting a Wednesday Night Café on May 10th at 7pm at Epiphany on homelessness and the work done at Family Promise to assist families experiencing homelessness. The presentation is titled "Housing is a Human Right" and will be given by Beth Bojarski, Manager of Development and Community Engagement at FPGROC. We also have the opportunity to do a service project at the Day Center on Saturday, May 13th from 1-4pm and there will be a book discussion on the

same day at 11:30am. The book study will be on the book called Poverty, by America by Matthew Desmond. There is a sign-up for both events for Family Promise on the bulletin board in the main hallway. Bring a bag lunch and spend the day at Family Promise and see what great work they are doing. Epiphany is also collecting in-kind donations for two moving kits for clients as they transition out of Family Promise into their own apartments. The items requested are kitchen items and needed cleaning supplies. There are tags on the bulletin board with the requested donated items which we would like at church by May 28th. We are also going to provide some special treats for the guests and staff of FPGROC on May 21st. Please look at the Service Ministry bulletin board in the hallway for more details and to sign up for the various events.

Our June project will be collecting items for our Little Red Food Box at the Epiphany Church Picnic on Sunday, June 11. Donations of personal products and non-perishable food are welcome. More details will be coming in the church bulletin as we get closer to June.

The Service Ministry team will be planning additional projects for summer. Please feel free to contact any member on the Service Ministry team if you have any suggestions for projects or would like to join our team. We appreciate all the support from the parishioners at Epiphany.

Rector Search Committee

Search Committee May Update

The search process is now transitioning to Phase II, which means that the open rector position has been posted. This first posting of the rector position will continue until April 30rd and renewed as necessary. The open position is posted in four locations: the local Rochester Diocese website, the national Episcopal Newsletter, Office of Transitional Ministry and at the Regional Transitional Ministry Conference.

Virginia Tyler- Smith, the Transitional Dean for our diocese, will be reviewing all potential candidates. Any candidate that is deemed qualified will then be vetted by the Episcopal Diocese of Rochester before being presented to the Search Committee for consideration.

In preparation for the interview process, the Search Committee has been updating our Church's social media sites. This includes the Church's website, Facebook and Instagram pages. The Team has also prepared interview questions and conducted a mock interview. The Search Team is ready when candidates are identified for consideration for Epiphany's rector position.

We will continue to keep you updated frequently.

Parish Scholarships

Thanks to the generosity of the families and friends of the Rev'd John VanBrederode and Karen Marr, we are fortunate to have two funds which provide assistance for post-secondary education. The deadline for both is **Sunday, May 7th.**

How are recipients chosen? The Scholarship Committee meets and reviews all applications. It may, at its discretion, interview the applicants.

Who serves on the Committee? A member of the Vestry, a representative from the Church School or J2A program, a representative from one of the parish's Teams or Committees, and an "at-large" parishioner.

Notification: The Committee will notify each applicant of its decision in writing by June 4th. Recipients will be announced on a Sunday in June, at the 10:00 a.m. service.

John VanBrederode - Memorial Scholarship

Eligible applicants:

- * Graduating High school seniors
- * have been active in the life of Epiphany
- * will continue their studies in college or trade school

Karen Marr - Memorial Award

Eligible applicants must:

- * have "special need." Special need can be a physical or learning disability.
- * have completed one year of post-high school education. Continuing education can be college or trade school.
- * be a confirmed member of The Church of the Epiphany for at least one year.

Note: The Marr Award is available 3 times per year. Application deadlines are May 1st, August 1st and December 1st.


GARDEN
