

Business:

1. Approve the April 18, 2023 Vestry Meeting Minutes. M-S-A to approve April 18, 2023 Vestry Meeting Minutes.

2. Finance Report: Deb reported the budget and pledges are on target. Not in deficit. Utilities have straightened out. Supply is over budget, not enough budgeted. Will be remedied. M-S-A to accept May 18, 2023 Treasurer's Report,

3. Shredding old documents securely – update: Deb reported that she and Nick will get together soon to determine how much there is to do. Certain records have to be kept for 7 years and some forever.

4. Safe Church training-Church sexual harassment: Kathy reported on hold for now. Still need to make phone call. Company has changed, Administration not available. Everything is the same just need to have updated. Keep on agenda.

5. Pastoral Care: Don talked about the need for pastoral care that Gladys and Birdie reported on at the last meeting. They haven't had much support for the past 3 years. He would like to use funds from the Memorial Fund (which has approx \$20,000) to address this problem. Guidelines for use of funds speak to use for securing worship or parish ministry. He contacted Virginia about asking if we could contract w/priest to help out for 4 or 5 months at a fee of \$20-25/month. She informed him there are priests available(Harden, Pittman, and Burkhardt) to do some pastoral care for free. The priests that Jimmie Sue, when she resigned, said were available for emergency calls are no longer available. Discussion followed to at least make a gas card available. If we need money, it will be withdrawn from the Memorial Fund. Susan mentioned that through Pastoral Care/Red Cross, Krystal, an Episcopal priest might be willing to help. Also Dahn (has been supply priest at Epiphany). Don will talk with Gladys and Birdie to reiterate what they see as the need from the priests. After Don has talked with them, he will contact the 5 names supplied to see if anyone is willing, maybe have 4 different ones available. Mike offered to let them know that on an as need basis, a stipend would be available. Lisa offered not always just homebound parishioners but their families might need help, would be somebody to call on or just for funerals.

6. Internet update/Spectrum: In a holding pattern until we receive the co-pay form(trouble with email contact at Spectrum). As soon as Epiphany receives the invoice, a check will be sent. Work can begin.

7. Clean out pole barn: Tabled, Kristin reported that nobody was interested in taking the Pride stuff. Will be thrown out.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Update Church Policies: It's been approximately 15 years since last updated. Should be updated every 5 years. Book is in the Rector's office with other forms and 10 or more policies to look at. Once we have a new Rector they can be looked at to see if anything has changed and then be updated.

2. Small group updates: Service Ministry hosted the Wednesday Night café with a presentation by Family Promise. It was well attended and received by 14 attendees. 3 volunteers from Epiphany attended their second Saturday work party and painted a bedroom. People will be able to follow Family Promise on Epiphany's facebook page Deb reported there will be another presentation on Alzheimers and Dimentia in the Fall. Under Adult Formation there will a trip to Blue Barn Cidery in July. Also a trip to the Windmill in Oct.

There was discussion how many people were looking at our facebook videos. 35 views on Family Promise. 142 views of CofE service. Should we be using these numbers for our Sunday attendance? Will check with Diocese to see how we could include this in our Parochial Report. Mike made an observation to link to Tithely - to support Epiphany with donation. A discussion followed of how donation could be on facebook with a link to tithely, There was concern expressed about safety with this link on facebook. Mike responded that this is very safe. Kim will look into this.

3. Search Committee Update: Tabled as there wasn't anyone present to update status.

4. Church Directory Update: There is an updated list in computer from November 2022. A copy will be printed off and left on table in foyer to add themselves to directory or change of address. Still need someone to update current names by looking through older directories to see if they are still part of the parish. Records of actively pledging or giving is another source of checking to see if still part of parish. We have had visitors and listed as visitors that have joined the parish.

5. Update plaques: Warden's names it has been 10 years since updated. Also Memorial Garden plaques. Discussed using Memorial Fund for plaques. About 6 months ago Jack brought it up. Will ask Birdie about the plaques for Columbarium.

We have priest supply coverage from May 25 through September 24. Need sign up for when Paddy is the supply priest to help with picking him up and taking him home. Mike will pickup at 8a.m. Nancy Hatz is recovering from hip surgery and needs ride to come back to Church.

CLOSING PRAYER AND ADJOURN: Closing prayer given by Susan. Motion made and carried to adjourn the Tuesday, May 16 2023 Vestry Meeting at 8:00p.m.

Service Ministry May Update

Epiphany adopted Family Promise of Greater Rochester (FPGROC, formerly RAIHN) for the month of May. FPGROC assists families at risk of or experiencing homelessness to achieve independence in collaboration with the greater community. There were many opportunities for parishioners to be involved with Family Promise. Service Ministry and Adult Formation hosted a Wednesday Night Café on May 10th at 7pm which was well attended. The presentation was titled "Housing is a Human Right" and was given by Beth Bojarski, Manager of Development and Community Engagement at FPGROC. The talk focuses on homelessness and the work being done at Family Promise to assist families experiencing homelessness. The presentation was live streamed and posted on the church's Facebook page.

On May 13th, a few members from Epiphany were involved at Second Saturday at Family Promise of Greater Rochester. In the morning, Marsha Pulhamus attended a book discussion on Poverty, my America by Matthew Desmond. Later that day, Donna Perry, Pat Lesher and Marsha Pulhamus spent the afternoon working at Family Promise. We were busy painting some newly acquired apartments at FPGROC. We all enjoyed meeting other volunteers helping out at Family Promise.



Epiphany also collected in-kind donations for two moving kits for clients as they transition out of Family Promise into their own apartments. The moving kits include kitchen items and needed cleaning supplies. Kathy Entress, Betty Frisch and Nancy Mancini made some special treats for the guests and staff of FPGROC which were delivered on May 22nd.

A big thank you to the parishioners of Epiphany for their generous in–kind donations, time and talents helping out on Second Saturday, attendance at the Wednesday Café and making baked treats for the family and staff at Family Promise. It was a very successful month helping Family Promise of Greater Rochester with their goal with helping families facing homelessness in Rochester.

Our June project will be collecting items for our Little Red Food Box at the Epiphany Church Picnic on Sunday, June 11. We are requesting donations of personal products and non-perishable food. Some suggestions include canned foods such as soup, chili, fruits, vegetables, pasta sauce and beans, boxed foods such as pasta, cereal, oatmeal packets, rice and crackers and personal products such as soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, shampoo, feminine products, diapers, wipes, razors and lotion.

The service Ministry team will also be planning additional projects for summer including our annual collection of school supplies for Hope Hall School. Parish Scholarships

Thanks to the generosity of the families and friends of the Rev'd John VanBrederode and Karen Marr, we are fortunate to have two funds which provide assistance for post-secondary education. The deadline for both is **Sunday, May 7th.**

Eligible applicants:

- * Graduating High school seniors
- * have been active in the life of Epiphany
- * will continue their studies in college or trade school

Karen Marr - Memorial Award

Eligible applicants must:

- * have "special need." Special need can be a physical or learning disability.
- * have completed one year of post-high school education. Continuing education can be college or trade school.
- * be a confirmed member of The Church of the Epiphany for at least one year.


Note: The Marr Award is available 3 times per year. Application deadlines are May 1st, August 1st and December 1st.
