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### **VESTRY VIEWS**

Hello all,

My name is Mike Grasso and I am currently a member of your vestry at our Church of Epiphany.

In the May vestry meeting, there was a signup sheet being passed around. Among other items on this signup sheet, was a View from the Vestry slot for August. To my surprise I put my name down to share my thoughts.

I find myself asking Why?

Why come to Church of the Epiphany?

- Why support this church?
- Why is what the church does important?
- First a bit of my back story:

When I first came to our church 40 plus years ago it was to get married, and this was the church that my wife grew up in. At this point in my life, this church or that church mattered little to me. I was much younger at this time and did not see much value in a church. My wife and I moved away for a time and left the church only to come back several years later and with our son to raise.

Over time I became a bit more involved with some of the church functions, dinners, light repairs, mowing and the like. I got to know some of the people and started to feel a sense of community. Over time I attended some of the adult worship opportunities and learned a bit more about the spiritual part of the beliefs that we take part in.

Dear Epiphany Parishioners,

As you may be aware, we are engaged in a prayerful Discernment and Planning process to help us determine directions for our parish in the coming months and years.

It is important to us that you understand what is happening every step of the way and participate in the process. Let me take this opportunity to share what we are doing in a little more detail.

At the direction of the Vestry, a small group of talented parishioners including Heidi McGrath, Kim Hyde, Blaine Kaercher, Margaret Schweizer, Nick Parisi and

myself, have begun a prayerful process, with the consultative help of the Reverend Julie Cicora, to set clear, attainable and measurable goals and objectives for the parish.

As we gather data and discuss our options, we are taking our time to pray together regularly and watch for signs of the Spirit's guidance. At each of our meetings we have read and discussed the lessons from the book, "Grounded in God: Listening Hearts Discernment for Group Deliberations".

We are using what is referred to as the Appreciative Inquiry (AI) theory of change management, which is designed to build on our strengths. In other words, rather than identifying a particular problem and then trying to find a fix, the AI approach asks, "What do we appreciate most about our parish, what are our strengths, what do we do well, and what do we have to offer the world?", then builds a strategic plan on that. As the old song goes... "You gotta Ac-cent-tchu-ate the positive, E-lim-i-nate the negative, latch on to the affirmative".

Here is a rough outline of our approach...

Step One: Discern the strengths of the parish and what are parishioners' primary interests and social concerns.

To this end, we are organizing numerous small groups where parishioners will enjoy each other's company while you share what you find special about Epiphany, why you joined the parish, and what gets you up on Sunday morning to come to church. In addition, we will ask you to identify your greatest social concerns.

After this data has been gathered and studied, we should have a good idea of our strengths and resources, as well as where our primary concerns lie. We will share the results back to everyone. At this point, we will invite the Rev. Julie Cicora to come to help us process the information, and address steps two and three.

### Step Two: Take a look at our three primary baptismal vows to see how we're doing.

Our baptismal vows frame our vocation or calling in the world. The question is, how well are we keeping these vows, which include:

- 1. Proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ.
- 2. Seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves.
- 3. Strive for justice and peace among all people, respecting the dignity of every human being.
- Step three: See what emerges in the conversation between steps one and two. We will look to find connections with what's happening around us, e.g. in Gates, and determine how, in response to our baptismal promises, we can use our strengths to take action in areas of greatest interest to our parishioners.

### **Step four:** Determine specific goals and objectives for the parish We will translate possible actions, from Step Three, into measurable goals. Once several goals (2-4) have been set we will seek the approval of vestry and then disseminate the plan to the entire parish and work with those involved in the implementation thereof.

Step five:Implement and evaluate progressWe will monitor progress along the way and hold an annual evaluation of the goals,<br/>adjusting as appropriate,

This is our plan to follow the Spirit into the future. It is a work in progress, and we will keep you posted as it morphs and changes.

# VESTRY MINUTES JUNE 18, 2024

Opening Prayer: Fr. Greg opened with prayer. Vestry meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m.

### **BUSINESS:**

- 1. Approve May Vestry Minutes. A motion was made to approve May 21, 2024, Minutes. M-S-A
- 2. Finance Report and Motion to Approve. Deb submitted the Treasurer's Report via e-mail. Mike reported that income was under budget, but so were expenses. Don reported that tips were \$500 from the Red Wings' games for Tuesday and Sunday. Also, as part of our fundraising we will be receiving a check for \$1200 from the Red Wings. A motion was made to approve the Finance Report. M-S-A
- 3. Team for Parish Audit 2023. Vestry will have to select and approve the team. Audit due end of June. Vestry needs to approve the Audit so we can submit it by the end of the month. The team is composed of Kathie, Nick and Dave with Deb and Bruce available to answer questions as they go over all the information requested by the Diocese for the Parish Audit 2023. The procedure for filling out this many pages form was discussed and reviewed with Fr. Greg and Vestry. Once the Team has completed the required information, the Certificate of Parish Audit along with appropriate Bank Statements, Treasurer's Report, Epiphany Records of Checking, Savings and Investment balances as of 12/31/23 will be submitted to the Diocese. A motion was made to approve Certificate of Parish Audit w/pending amendments and changes. M-S-A
- 4. Paychex Update. A meeting has yet to be set up to address the issue discussed in the May Vestry Minutes.
- 5. Safe Church Training Church Sexual harassment. Kathie will send emails soon to let know who has completed training. Fr. Greg discussed what is expected from them and he believes he has finished. Kathie can see who has completed the training and will send them on. Kathie said this job sort of fell into her lap so it's a work in progress on her part.
- 6. Internet update/Spectrum/Phones-updates. Don reported that 2 repeaters have been installed, one inside the church the other down the hall. So now we have 2 in the hallway and 1 in the church. The strength of the signal is great all around this area and into Robert's office. This past Sunday Pete was having

problems videoing in the church, message that there was a slow connection. Kathie mentioned this has happened with her too, but if you don't fiddle around with it all will be fine. The extender is about 10 feet away so there shouldn't be an issue. As far as Don knows everything is good with the streaming right now.

7. Strategic Planning. Fr. Greg reported the name has been changed to Parish Discernment. Discernment being the key factor, listening to God's direction. We had a meeting scheduled but several couldn't make it. Since we are a small group and two were missing, it didn't make sense to meet. A meeting will be held tomorrow night with all in attendance. It is taking a little while longer than imagined getting under way.

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS:**

1. Small group updates.

a) Social Media. Margaret commented that Kim is doing a great job with pictures and posts on Facebook.

b) Adult Formation. Kathie reported there is nothing scheduled for now. She did get a suggestion from Kristen about the Oakland Migrant Ministry/Brockport, possibly speaking at a Wednesday night cafe about their ministry. We did have a meeting with the Turkish Cultural Center to discuss a Potluck picnic to be held at Epiphany. This will be held at a Wed night cafe in September, starting with dinner and then conversation. Fr. Greg is still working on the evening, but they are excited as we are about the interaction. Fr. Greg said we want to make sure we're not the givers and they are the receivers; we are equals gathering together. Marsha has suggested perhaps we could do a service project related to something that's important to them in the upcoming months.

c) Liturgy Planning. Fr. Greg reported they haven't met yet. They will meet in late Summer to plan all the services through the Fall.

d) Welcome. Donna reported she had talked with Laurie. She does greet and welcome newcomers. Whatever information she gathers she gives to Maureen. Fr. Greg will talk with Laurie about how we can nurture people into membership in the Church potentially. We do have some new young families. Recently we just had a couple formally join the church. Coming from a Lutheran background and after exploring all area churches, they decided on Epiphany. How do we encourage parishioners to really welcome newcomers into the Church? There are welcoming bags distributed with what Epiphany has to offer. Fr. Greg offered we could have a general announcement to anybody who is new and may not yet have an opportunity to join our parish. If you would like to, here's how you do it. Just keep it as an opportunity to generically work it into a sermon.

e) Youth. Sue reported on July 6, there is going to be a campfire. In September J2A will meet on 1st and 3rd Sun and on 2nd Sun all meet together. They would like another volunteer teacher for Sunday School especially with the age difference between the children. Sunday School begins September 8.

2. Property and Liability insurance. Kathie met with the person from the insurance to discuss our policy. They have a pole barn listed as a storage shed. We gave them the dimensions of the storage shed and pole barn, talked about the value of the contents and the value of the buildings. Discussed raising the deductible but the saving was minimal and decided to leave as is. The cost did go up this year \$976 over last year but reflects the changes we made and is a better fit. It was the first time in many years that the policy has been reviewed. They did give us credit towards our account because we were in good standing. So, insurance has been updated to adequately cover any losses.

- 3. Sound System. Fr. Greg reported last month we approved \$500 for updating the sound system. He spent \$500 and we have all the equipment in the house ready to go. The sound will come straight out of the microphones out of the mixer into the computer that's going to live stream. He gave further details on how the sound system will work and how it will be more effective. He is working with Kim who has put PowerPoints on multiple projects. They will do a dry run, lay it out, set up the equipment before installing it to make sure it all runs. Then they will need a team of people to install all the wires, drill holes in concrete etc. So, the project is moving forward and he's very hopeful about this helping with the future of the church.
- 4. Organ update. So, the question of the organ and how long will it last. Robert was able to go to CT and play the organ in question. He said it would be an incredible upgrade for us. Will put this info on hold for now. Robert said there haven't been any issues with organ this past Sunday. Discussion ensued about if we did purchase the pipe organ where and how it would be installed. Also discussed what are the future participants in the church going to be looking for in a service pipe organ, guitar and drums or something else. Since this will be a decision that will last for decades, we should discern now what direction as a church we are going. Further discussion followed about monies available to fund a pipe organ within Epiphany and the diocese if we went in that direction. If our organ does suddenly die, we have an electric keyboard and piano that we can fall back on.
- 5. Parish grant update. Kathie reported that we got an email this week saying that the financial information we sent out was outdated information Not sure what happened, but Deb is working on the new financial information which will be re-submitted. Kathie will make sure everything is updated on the computer. The information will be back to them before they meet again on July 3. Fr. Greg got a call on the Mission Partnership Grant that we submitted that is in consideration. Also asked if they are a 501c3 and they are so they meet the criteria. So, we should hear affirmation in the near future.
- 6. Street sign update. Mike reported that Don has offered to help him and it should be completed tomorrow morning.
- 7. 12 Step program. Fr. Greg said the 12-step program has been meeting here the last couple of weeks. The signup (to unlock the front door until the person comes, then lock the door and leave) looks good all the way through September. They gave us a nice donation and will probably give us approximately \$40/month.
- 8. Update on Turkish Community Center. Discussed under the above: Adult Formation.
- 9. Common cup and Altar railing. Fr. Greg asked for thoughts on how to address this issue. Don commented he had some feedback from a parishioner who attends an Episcopal Church while she's in Fl. for the winter. Discussion followed., I.e. kneeling or standing at altar rail for wafer, taking the wine from the common cup or going to a table set up with little cups for wine or not taking the wine in either fashion. The diocese recommends not dunking wafer in wine as it is more unsanitary than drinking and wiping the edge. After much discussion about the common cup and also using little cups. Fr Greg suggested we try kneeling or standing at the altar rail, taking the wafer then the wine from a common cup. Before communion they offer the option of not taking the common cup after the bread but have the little cup option at a table by the Columbarium administered by Eucharistic Minister or they don't have to take the wine at all. It's still a full communion. Discussion ensued how the ushers would be involved in letting

people out for communion which led to Kathie proposing a training session for ushers, greeters, eucharistic ministers and acolytes and what all their duties are. A training session will be scheduled for July 14 after 10:00 service. At the July 14 services, it will be announced to the congregation that we are returning to the altar rail for communion the following Sunday, July 21, 2024.

- 10. Fr. Greg reported we are moving to Church Windows. Kim found a way to pull out several reports that we use from Church Windows so that we don't need the Directory anymore. Church Windows can produce that and the birthday list. So, we're going to get the data in Church Windows. Church Windows can be sectioned off so only the pledge clerk sees the pledge information. Maureen and Fr. Greg and whatever else needs it can get the contact information that includes name, address, phone, email address, date of birth and anniversary date. Kim has worked on creating reports we need. She is going through A to Z cleaning up the deck. She has put in a lot of time and energy with a lot of help from Mike to get this in order. We are moving in a good direction. We just have to make sure Maureen knows how to use it; she is an amazing support person. Hats off to Kim for this and the live streaming, the camera and sound systems as well.
- 11. Kathie inquired if we are doing Vestry Views for the STAR and is the Vestry meeting in July. There will be one STAR July/August for the Summer. Mike has signed up for Vestry Views for August. August is closer to the beginning of the Sunday School year and other things that need to be discussed for the Fall. A motion was made to skip the July meeting and meet on August 20. M-S-A
- Fr. Greg closed with a prayer. The Vestry meeting adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

Next meeting will be on August 20, 2024.


