2025: A New Year!

As we enter the month of February, we are reminded of the power of love and kindness in our lives. Valentine's Day, a celebration of love, offers us a special opportunity to reflect on how we can share God's love with those around us. I was thinking about all the kindness that I witness at Epiphany every time I am here in this building and in the company of the people here. Some moments happen before you enter the building, like people carrying things from the parking lot for others or helping those who might need some assistance out of their car. I continue to see the brushing off snow of other people's cars or parishioners dropping off items in the Free Food Box.

The kindness and love continues inside the building. Parishioners reach out to one another, checking in on family members who may be in need of prayer. People stop for a hug or greet each other at the door. Others help the ushers, bringing up the elements or taking up the collection. During the service, The Peace takes some time because of the warm greetings offered to one another.

We show love for the community through our support of the Service Ministry Team. Their outreach ranges from donating hot chocolate packets and cans of soup to fiber ministry and food baskets for Easter and Christmas. Dear Church of the Epiphany,

A blessed Epiphany season to you! Here are a few updates on larger parish projects.

Annual Meeting:

Our annual meeting went smoothly. Thanks to everyone who provided breakfast and all who prepared reports! For some reason, it was difficult this year to find people willing to serve on the Vestry. Hopefully, this will not be the case when we go to roll out the strategic pastoral plan in the months ahead and ask you, our parishioners, to help implement it.

Organ Replacement:

The Organ Replacement Task Force has been busy researching options to ensure quality liturgical music here at Epiphany. We've been working with a consultant, John Sherer, who has significant expertise as an organist and in organ repair, replacement, and capital campaign projects. John is the director of music at St. Paul's Church in Rochester, and also the husband of our Bishop Kara.

There are numerous factors involved in determining the best option for us. These include cost (both to purchase and to maintain), sound quality for our church, attractiveness for musicians, musical preferences of the congregation now and in the future, and how music fits into our vision for the future of the parish.

Also in the mix is a possible upgrade to our piano because we are finding that pianists are more readily available than organists. The cost to upgrade a piano is relatively small. It could even be free to purchase and limited to the cost to move it.

The team has been looking at the various types and brands of instruments. We visited several churches in Rochester to listen to their organs. We thought we had a solid option in the organ at St Stephen's Episcopal Church in the 19th Ward that recently closed its doors, but it turned out to be too fragile to move. In February, we are driving to Buffalo to listen to two other types of organs.

We hope to have a concrete proposal to Vestry this Spring.

Discernment and Planning Team:

The Discernment and planning team has made great progress in prayerfully determining directions for our parish. We have taken your input and focused on using our greatest strengths to develop our parish in positive directions. We want to ensure that all areas and activities of our church include an intentional outreach to the wider Gates/Chili community. We will propose a revitalization of our "five small groups" structure and have rewritten their mission statements giving them a more outreaching and invitational spin.

We are currently researching, brainstorming, and drafting some exciting goals that we hope will enhance parish life and share the good news of God in Christ with the world around us. We are working to keep the goals clear and specific yet flexible so that those charged with implementation have some control over what we do.

Once this Strategic Plan is proposed, amended, and ratified by Vestry, you will hear all about it in greater detail. Then we will need all the parishioners to get involved to make it a success, ensuring a bright future for the Church of the Epiphany.

Church and State

I believe that most of us, me included, want to come to church to escape the tension and divisiveness of politics, and the last thing we want to hear is anything that will cause more tension. Yet, as we follow Jesus, who gave his life standing up for the needs of the poor and oppressed, we realize that there are times we too must speak up on behalf of those in greatest need. I have had a significant number of parishioners speak up in the last few days with concerns about the direction our country appears to be heading. When the Rt. Rev. Mariann Budde, Episcopal Bishop of Washington, gave a [sermon](#) for the inauguration prayer service calling for mercy and compassion in governmental affairs, some were upset by her words and thought they were too political, others were encouraged and felt proud to be Episcopalian.

In response to Bishop Budde's sermon, a [video](#) was posted recently by Bishop Michael Hunn, the Episcopal Bishop of Rio Grande, that explains his role as Bishop in the relationship between church and state. I found this very informative.

I see this as an opportunity to learn and grow in our faith, so, for anyone interested, I invite you to gather with me on February 9th after our worship service to watch and discuss these two videos.

VESTRY MINUTES, DECEMBER 17, 2024

ZOOM MEETING

Opening Prayer: Fr. Greg opened with prayer and the Vestry Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

BUSINESS:

1. Approve November Vestry Minutes. A motion was made to approve November 19, 2024, Minutes. M-S-A
2. Finance Report and motion to approve. Deb reported 2024 pledges are a little behind, still have the month of December. Kitchen supplies are up (purchasing more for the future). Deb said we are right on target (91.7%) for Diocesan Apportionment. Other than not hearing or receiving anything about the ERTC money, everything is OK. In regard to ERTC, Nick noticed something online recently that in order to qualify for the ERTC your gross assets had to have been reduced by 50-80%. Don said if this was one of the requirements and Epiphany was never made aware of it, we may have been intentionally misled by Paychex. Don will pursue this matter further with Paychex. A motion was made to approve the Finance Report. M-S-A
3. Safe Church training - Church sexual harassment. Kathie reported the Eucharistic Ministers have not completed training. She hopes to set up a group session after the first of the year.
4. Strategic Planning. Fr. Greg reported from the sessions held in October, it was determined our greatest strengths are our warm, welcoming and inclusive community, plus our outreach to the Gate/Chili community in supporting those in the greatest need. The question is, how do we share our strengths with the community? The Discernment Team has concluded that the best approach is 'personal invitation'. We already have a structure in place through 5 small groups that have been established in the past few years. Working with these 5 groups we want to update the mission and goals and focus on strengthening our ability to share our gifts with more people through personal invitations. In our next phase of discernment, we will be reaching out to new young families for their input, i.e. what they need and how we can support them.
5. Stewardship/Annual Giving. Deb reported 2025 pledged income is up to \$127,880 with 66 pledges.

6. AED. Don has talked with Jim Wackerow. He said they are having difficulty finding info on what and where to buy. Don told him he will research where to purchase AED and what is involved with installation and training and forward info to Jim.
7. Organ taskforce. Nick reported they met on November 26 with consultant John Sherer to play our organ, which he noted is not in good shape. Besides the pipe organ at St. Stephens, there is a digital organ at Christ Church that might be available. Purchasing a new piano to hold us over was discussed. It was proposed to have Parsons Organ Co. look at the pipe organ from St. Stephens for the cost of work that needs to be done and installation cost. Don reiterated where the money would come from is the Vestry's job not the task force. Since this was discussed about 8 months ago, the funds will be revisited to find out how much is available. With all that's involved, this continues to be an ongoing project.
8. Organist update. Fr. Greg reported there was one bite from a junior at Roberts Wesleyan. She auditioned for Gail and will audition with the choir. She has only been playing for a year. Possibly, she could be a temporary hire until Summer. There weren't any other applicants. We have coverage through January.
9. Kitchen refrigerator update. Don hasn't had an opportunity to look at Home Depot or Orvilles yet. Fr. Greg said he will contact a friend who knows refrigerator brands and will inquire what to stay away from and what he would recommend.
10. Budget 2025. Deb reported the pledged amount has been raised to \$128,000. Total deficit \$28,756. There was a discussion about office expenses that seemed to have doubled; Deb and Don will investigate. A motion was made and carried to approve recommended raises in the 2025 Budget. M-S-A
11. Nominating Committee. Don reported they (Helen, Lisa and Margaret) haven't had a meeting yet. Some names have been suggested. There will be an article in the bulletin or STAR if interested, to contact the Nominating Committee. Discussion of how many weeks prior to the Annual Meeting are candidates announced. The by-laws will be consulted.
12. IT Proposal for office and internet. Fr. Greg reported that Maureen's sister's company did come to evaluate our system. We need a safe network system for office computers to communicate with each other. Also don't have a firewall. An estimate for an upgrade to the system is \$2500. We will investigate this a little further

Also, the live streaming (FACEBOOK) of the service has a strong signal but not the sound system.

13. Fr. Greg's Housing Resolution:

Be it Resolved That: Whereas, Gregory J Kremer is employed as a minister of the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany, Gates, in the Diocese of Rochester, NY, which does not provide a residence for him, the Vestry of the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany resolves that of his total compensation in 2025, \$28,420 be designated a parsonage allowance within the meaning of that term as used in Section 107 of the IRS Code of 1986 and this designated amount be assumed to be the amount in future years, as long as Gregory J Kremer is employed at the Episcopal Church of the Epiphany, unless amended.

The preceding motion has been approved and carried. M-S-A

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Small Group updates.

a. Social Media. Margaret reported the group is posting on Facebook by advertising what is happening at the Church. Fr. Greg suggested the Discernment website needs a face lift and this group could use 2 or more members.

b. Adult Formation. Kathie reported that Maria will lead a Creation Care Workshop following the 10 a.m. service on January 12. A light lunch will be served. On February 5, Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. in the Auxiliary Room or via ZOOM Maria will lead a workshop on Gender and Liturgy.

c. Liturgy Planning. Nick said the group will meet February 2 to plan for Lent and the remainder of the year.

d. Welcome. Fr. Greg said Laurie has prepared new bags for welcoming newcomers to the Church. Also, we should always be welcoming and reaching out to folks whenever possible.

e. Youth. Sue reported the distribution of Angel ornaments to the Assisted Living unit and candy canes (from the younger kids) to the Memory Care unit at Seabury Woods was a great success. The youth will be involved in the 4:30 p.m. Christmas Eve service. The Rite 13 girls are putting off their painting project until January.

2. Fr. Greg said the Annual Meeting is set for January 26, 2025. There will be one service at 9:30 a.m. We begin with continental breakfast at 8:45, 9:15 start meeting, open polling; 9:30 break for Church service; appoint Clerk for the Annual Meeting; Annual Meeting will continue following the Church service.

3. Vestry Views for Jan. – Nick

The next Vestry meeting will be January 21, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. via ZOOM.

Fr. Greg closed with a prayer; the Vestry meeting was adjourned at 8:10 p.m.

FEBRUARY SERVICE MINISTRY UPDATE

Our current ministry project is collecting canned goods for St. Theodore's Food Pantry. The event will run 1/19- 2/9/25. The items needed include soups, chili and canned pasta. Our goal this year is to try and collect at least 449 cans which will beat the 2024 collection of 448 cans.

Later in February, the Service Ministry team will be working with the Youth of Epiphany to supply Blessing Bags to SWEM. SWEM is a community food cupboard serving the southwest region of Rochester/Monroe County. Blessing Bags include food items to help individuals who are experiencing food insecurity and don't have access to a kitchen to refrigerate or cook food items. Suggested items include juice

boxes, granola bars, crackers, fruit or pudding cups. Specifics about the collection will be in the bulletin in mid-February. The youth will assemble the Blessing Bags for their Lent service project.

Epiphany will be coordinating a team or two for the Family Promise's bowling fundraiser. Bowl-A-Thon is a great fundraiser for Family Promise of Greater Rochester (FPGROC). The Bowl-A-Thon is happening on Sunday, March 9th at Bowl-A-Roll Lanes on 1560 Jefferson Road. The check-in time is 12:45pm and bowling starts at 1:30pm. The cost is \$50/person or \$300/lane (6 bowlers per lane) which includes shoe rental, two games and pizza. If you are interested in joining "Team Epiphany" for this event, there will be a sign-up sheet in the main hallway. The final date to sign up for this event will be Sunday, February 2nd at 12 noon so we submit our request to participate in this event.

We are working on some fundraising to help defray some of the cost. The fundraisers include proceeds from the can and bottle donations at church through March 1st and a bake food sale at the Shrove Tuesday Pancake dinner on March 4th. Each participant will need to be responsible for the remaining cost to participate in the event (likely \$30-40) depending on our success at raising funds and the number of participants. Please feel free to talk to Kathy Entress or Marsha Pulhamus if you have any questions.

For Lent, the youth will be involved in packing food items collected by the Service Ministry team for Blessing Bags for SWEM. Blessing Bags include food items to help individuals who are experiencing food insecurity and don't have access to a kitchen to refrigerate or cook food items. The date of the packing event has not been decided at this time.

A gentle reminder for everyone that the youth are collecting can and bottle money to help with fund raising. You can either put your empty cans and bottles in the trash receptacle in the hallway leading to the fellowship hall or hand in bottle receipts or monies received when you redeem the deposit on your cans and bottles. The container for the bottle receipts and money redeemed is located on the large desk in the main hallway.

Parish Scholarships

Thanks to the generosity of the families and friends of the Rev'd John VanBrederode and Karen Marr, we are fortunate to have two funds which provide assistance for post-secondary education. The deadline for both is **Sunday, May 5th.**

How are recipients chosen? The Scholarship Committee meets and reviews all applications. It may, at its discretion, interview the applicants.

Who serves on the Committee? A member of the Vestry, a representative from the Church School or J2A program, a representative from one of the parish's Teams or Committees, and an "at-large" parishioner.

Notification: The Committee will notify each applicant of its decision in writing by June 2nd. Recipients will be announced on a Sunday in June, at the 10:00 a.m. service.

John VanBrederode - Memorial Scholarship

Eligible applicants:

- Graduating High school seniors
- Have been active in the life of Epiphany
- Will continue their studies in college or trade school

Karen Marr - Memorial Award

Eligible applicants:

- Have "special need." A special need can be physical or learning disability.
- Have completed one year of post-high school education. Continuing education can be college or trade school
- Be a confirmed member of The Church of the Epiphany for at least one year. Note: The Marr Award is available 3 times per year. Application deadlines are May 1st, August 1st and December 1st.

Marion Hunter Youth Assistance Fund

Purpose: Awards from the Hunter Youth Assistance Fund are to be used to sponsor young people's attendance and participation in church-related or religiously based special events, such as Creation Camp, national and local youth gatherings, etc.

Eligible applicants:



- Youth ages 8-18 years who have been active in the life of the parish.
- Applicants shall submit a short letter to the Rector, naming the event they wish to attend and what they hope to get out of it.

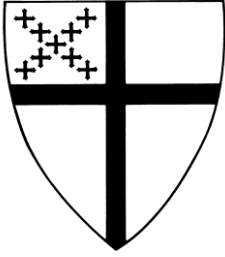
