Prayer requests remain for 6 weeks unless notified Faith in Action. Father Greg has a gift for helping us understand scripture lessons and pointing out how the lessons apply to our daily lives. I often find the message helps me see how "faith in action" works.

I experienced many examples of faith in action while helping at the WOE Rummage Sale. The donations ranged from baked goods, to linens, to clothing items, to quilts, to DVDs/CDs/books, to jewelry, to small appliances, to holiday decorations, and to more items than I can list. The volume and quality of the donations enabled the rummage sale to be a huge success. Thank you to everyone who contributed items.

A troop of volunteers unloaded donations into the Fellowship Hall and several classrooms after 10:00 Mass on 3/30. Many volunteers spent long hours during the week sorting, pricing, and setting up items for display. During the sale, volunteers helped shoppers in each room, acted as cashiers, sold baked goods, helped guests carry items to their vehicles, and directed traffic during the initial rush on Friday morning. While helping at the front door, I heard numerous shopper's mention: "wow, everyone is so friendly here." After the sale, a troop of volunteers helped box up unsold items, haul the boxes to the garage, break down tables for storage, and then vacuum or sweep and mop each room. Whew, what an amazing demonstration of faith in action.

The WOE rummage sales generated over \$6,000 in profit. The baked sale alone raised \$700. The generous donations of jewelry generated significant sales. The WOE hung a banner in the halls that listed community programs the sale supported:

We have completed our Pastoral Plan for the parish with some great goals and objectives designed to help us reach out a little more proactively into the Gates/Chili community. We're beginning to roll it out, hoping all of you will get involved in its implementation. It's a new time in the history of our church.

On May 11, our new Bishop Kara Wagner Sherer will be at Epiphany with us for the first time and will preside over our two liturgies. There will be plenty of pomp and circumstance associated with her first visit that should be quite enjoyable. It also happens to be Mother's Day

and Bishop Kara is in fact a mother. I look forward to hearing her preach on this day.

In addition to that, there's all kinds of new energy in the parish. 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VESTRY MINUTES MARCH 18, 2025

ZOOM MEETING

Present: Fr. Greg, Kathie Entress, Laurie Zaso, Susan Gaskill, Mike Grasso, Tim Kaercher, Heidi McGrath, Don Metzinger, Nick Parisi, Donna Perry, Kristen Smith, Don Voorhies, Deb Grasso, Pat Lesher

Tim opened with prayer and the Vestry Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m.

BUSINESS:

- 1. Approve March Vestry Minutes. A motion was made to approve February 18, 2025, Minutes. M-S-A
- 2. Finance Report and motion to approve. Deb reported she had included both January and February Finance Reports. Last month the January Finance Report was postponed by making some adjustments. There is nothing major for the February report, except the March RG&E electric bill has doubled from March 2024. Gas has remained pretty much on target. Nick questioned if she took note of what the kilowatt hours were and the usage between the 2. Bob Renehan has kept a spreadsheet over the years, and she will forward the March figures to him. A motion was made to approve the January and February Finance Reports. M-S-A
- 3. Spectrum Payment. Deb reported that Spectrum sends an email about the monthly payment. She normally waits for the paper statement to come before she pays, but lately it has been so close to the due date she has had to pay it online. She always makes a copy of payment, then attaches it to the paper statement. She knows this is going against one of the established controls we have for paying bills. After much discussion about how to handle this issue, a motion was made for Deb to authorize monthly autopay to Spectrum from our bank checking account. M-S-A
- 4. Computer Upgrade. Deb reported we have been working with Lucidity Works to get our computer and system upgraded. The budgeted contract was \$3455. So far, we have paid \$2949, which has been taken out of the Memorial fund. She thinks it really should be taken out of the Building Fund. She wants to know if she should continue using the Memorial Fund until the balance is paid rather than switching midstream. It was recommended to continue taking from the Memorial with notes explaining why and how the money was used. Then use the Seabury Fund, which is for capital expenses to reimburse the Memorial Fund for the withdrawals. Fr. Greg stated that the upgrade is kind of a mess right now. Basically, because it is such a busy season with Lent, there hasn't been time to change over the files and clean everything up. Hopefully, in the next month or two it will all be ironed out and work well. They are coming this week to hook up the wireless internet in church and in the fellowship hall. We will be able to get a stronger signal in the church which will give us a better picture.
- 5. Key Bank, three questions. Deb stated that we will be moving our safe deposit box from KeyBank, Chili to KeyBank, Gates where all our banking is done. Dave P. is the only one who has access to the Chili safe deposit box. We need a few people to look over what is in the box to be transferred and also to determine what is in the safe at Church that should be in the safe deposit box. The present size of the box is 3 x 10, \$100/yr; which we have paid and will transfer to the new one. We might need a larger size depending on what we transfer from the old box and church safe. The second issue is there are at least 8 bank credit cards out there, not sure who has them and if they are active. It was suggested the only people who should have them is Fr. Greg, Maureen and Pam to buy the necessary supplies the Church requires. The outstanding cards will be cancelled, and new ones will be issued to the 3 aforementioned people. Kathie will email Maria to see what the procedure is for cancelling the card and cc Deb and Laurie with her reply. Maria from Key Bank would like to speak to Vestry about our accounts and some ideas she has for us, i.e. switching from a rewards credit card to a cash back, protection we need against fraud as a business, and maybe using their bank for our pledge donations, etc. After much discussion, it was decided to have Maria come to the May meeting to make a brief presentation. Kathie will get in touch with Maria to set it up.
- 6. Cleaning Service bill increase. Don reported that the cleaning service bill has gone up from our original payment of \$425/mo. up to \$462, up 10% over the last 3 years. He would like to meet with them and go through the contract. Get our mind together with what we want and then talk to them about what they're doing. Then determine if we should look around at other cleaning services.

- 7. Strategic Planning. Fr. Greg distributed the proposed Pastoral Plan 2025 via email to the Vestry members. This proposed document covered Mindfulness Area Mission Statements, Proposed Goals for each Mindfulness Area, and Small Mindfulness Groups' Organization and Function. He stated he made some changes that had been recommended at the retreat (In the Mindfulness statements). He asked if there were any other changes to be made or questions. Nick asked about the home visits to new parishioners and how we defined a parishioner. Fr. Greg offered the definition of a parishioner that the Diocese gives. Our definition is how and when someone that has been attending church for a few months wants to become a member. Then when Fr. Greg feels it's appropriate, he approaches them and asks them if they would like to become a member of the Church. If they say yes, then the process begins. Following this discussion a motion was made to approve this Strategic Pastoral Plan for 2025. M-S-A. The guestion now is the implementation of this, which will be up to the Vestry to make this happen. How do we get the parish on board with this and the eventual sign up for the five small groups. After much discussion, it was decided to follow the course we used initially to develop the 5 core groups prior to Covid. Each group represented by 2 members from the initial group and a couple from Strategic planning would give a brief presentation of what their group is all about to the parish. The presentations would be Sunday, April 27 and Sunday, May 4. Prior to May 18 a colorful display board with a description of what each group does and hopes to do will be available for the parish to sign up. Select a group they want to be involved in to help Epiphany become even more part of our community. When the 5 groups meet on May 18, there will be at least a couple of people that are familiar with each group to facilitate the meeting. As more parishioners pick their group of interest, then we can begin implementing the goals proposed for each group.
- 8. AED. Don related that this past Sunday, Epiphany received a \$2000 donation from the Wackerows to purchase an AED. Don will be making an appointment with a recommended company to firm up the price, designate placement position and training. A thank you note will be sent to Jim and Linda.
- 9. Pianist update. A pianist, Jack Fecik, has been hired with a six month contract beginning April 27. He will be with us for six months every week through the summer and September. This also allows us to hire an organist if one should appear starting in September or October.
- 10. As an aside, Fr. Greg said Jim Stotts gave a very generous donation (\$1,000) in memory of his mother, Dottie. He would like us to get some nice flowers on an upcoming Sunday and use the rest for anything we want. So, Fr. Greg recommended the remainder be put into the general checking account to be there when needed. A thank you note will be sent to Jim.
- 11. Nominating Committee/Delegate. Fr. Greg talked to the Diocese about delegates, and we can have a maximum of 3 delegates to Convention. We have Emily Klinzing-Cirino as one delegate and Tom Seils as an alternate. We should try to appoint a couple more. A discussion followed about possible candidates. A couple of names came up and Fr. Greg will speak to them.
- 12. Mailbox use. Laurie pointed out that we have in-house mailboxes on the East side of the hallway previously used for Vestry members, various organizations and individuals to receive mail. Fr. Greg related that he has already put Vestry members' names on a box and to look in your box every once in a while.
- 13. Update Vestry Handbook. The Vestry Handbook is the binder that covers resolutions, policies, job descriptions, and contracts. In the past it has been given to Vestry members. Fr. Greg would like to have all the Vestry members have a copy. Deb has electronic copies from 2008 through 2014 which she will forward to Fr. Greg. He will take all the documents and put it up on the Google drive in a folder. Then at the next Vestry meeting look at them so we can produce an updated version.

14. Vestry Contact for Sunday Morning. Kathie related a request was made for us to sign up for different weeks again. When she talked to Maureen the schedule was already made up for April. The new schedule will begin in May. Kathie will send out an email to sign up for May and June. If you could sign up for a different week and email a reply to all, then she will work to set that up and work in 2-month blocks. She will forward the schedule to Maureen. She will also send around a sign up for STAR Vestry Views.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

Small group updates.

- <u>Welcome</u>. Laurie stated we have previously discussed May 11, Bishop's visitation when Placid and John will become members of the Episcopal Church.
- <u>Liturgy planning</u>. Fr. Greg relayed he will be publishing in this week's announcement the Holy Week Schedule from Palm Sunday to Easter.
- Youth. Sue reported they did the blessing bags this past week. Rite 13 is doing the coffee hour this week. They have Aria's baptism coming and the Rite 13 the first week in June.
- Adult Formation. Kathie didn't have anything to report.
- <u>Social Media</u>. Kristen reported they made an event on Facebook for the Rummage Sale. Fr. Greg related the live streams that came through the last couple of weeks has been good. Sometimes the sound varies; it could be to do with the quality of the phone. With the new wireless live stream in the Church, we have to make sure the person doing the live stream has the password. When Kim returns from Fl. they're going to work on the sound again. There's another little tool they want to try.

Tim closed the meeting with prayer.

The Vestry meeting was adjourned at 8:30 p.m.

Service Ministry Update

The service ministry team had two Lenten service ministry projects this year. The Fiber Ministry team collected handmade items including hat, scarves, mittens, socks, prayer shawls and blankets during Lent until Easter Sunday. All of the fiber ministry projects will be on display and blessed during the Sunday service on April 27th. Our grand total of projects was 138 items which is 345 % over our goal of 40 projects for the 40 days of Lent. PARISH SCHOLARSHIPS

Thanks to the generosity of the families and friends of the Rev'd John VanBrederode and Karen Marr, we are fortunate to have two funds which provide assistance for post-secondary education. The deadline for both is **Sunday, May 5th.**

How are recipients chosen? The Scholarship Committee meets and reviews all applications. It may, at its discretion, interview the applicants.

Who serves on the Committee? A member of the Vestry, a representative from the Church School or J2A program, a representative from one of the parish's Teams or Committees, and an "at-large" parishioner.

Notification: The Committee will notify each applicant of its decision in writing by June 2nd. Recipients will be announced on a Sunday in June, at the 10:00 a.m. service.

John VanBrederode - Memorial Scholarship

Eligible applicants:

- * Graduating High school seniors
- * have been active in the life of Epiphany
- * will continue their studies in college or trade school

Karen Marr - Memorial Award

Eligible applicants:

- * have "special need." A special need can be a physical or learning disability.
- * have completed one year of post-high school education. Continuing education can be college or trade school.
- * be a confirmed member of The Church of the Epiphany for at least one year.

Note: The Marr Award is available 3 times per year. Application deadlines are May 1st, August 1st and December 1st.

Marion Hunter Youth Assistance Fund

Purpose: Awards from the Hunter Youth Assistance Fund are to be used to sponsor young people's attendance and participation in church-related or religiously based special events, such as Creation Camp, national and local youth gatherings, etc.

Eligible applicants:

- *Youth ages 8-18 years who have been active in the life of the parish.
- *Applicants shall submit a short letter to the Rector, naming the event they wish to attend and what they hope to get out of it.


