Dear Church of the Epiphany,

I write this in anticipation of our upcoming annual Stewardship campaign.

Have you ever considered the fact that your life's story is an extension of Jesus' life story?

As Christians we are story tellers. We have an ancient narrative, one that describes the beginning of time and the relationship between God and God's Creation. We see this story grow through the Old Testament until it recounts the life and gifts of Jesus, whom we know as God's son. But the story doesn't end with the Resurrection just as it did not end with the Cross, it continues on in each of us today as we encounter and are transformed by the love of God in Christ.

Luke's Gospel begins and ends with the animated story-telling of two women named Mary. Early in the Gospel, Mary the mother of Jesus, tells us of her encounter with the Divine who informs her that she will bear a child who will change the world. She proclaims her joy: "Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!" At the end of the Gospel, another Mary, Mary Magdalene, visits the tomb to discover it empty and receives instructions from the Risen Christ to go tell the others. She carries this Good News with jubilance to the Disciples.

What is your Good News; the idea, dream, challenge placed in your heart by God, that needs to be shared? What is the ministry to which you are called which will change the world, sharing your talents, gifts, and love with your neighbors?

Our Stewardship Campaign this year focuses on these stories – the ones inside you, the ones you are still writing, the ones we tell about those who have gone before us. We are all a part of this ongoing story – the ongoing Creation. How will you choose to make your life story reflect the love of Jesus to the world around you?

The stories that we will share weekly throughout the campaign are designed to help spark the creativity in you to respond to the call to serve God and love our neighbor. As you pray about how you will share your gifts with us this year, think about how God is calling you to tell out your soul, to be an extension of the life of Jesus and allow his Spirit to work in and through you.

Tell out my soul! The Greatness of the Lord!

VESTRY MINUTES JUNE 17, 2025

Present: Fr. Greg, Kathie Entress, Laurie Zaso, Susan Gaskill, Tim Kaercher, Heidi McGrath, Don Metzinger, Nick Parisi, Donna Perry, Don Voorhies, Deb Grasso, Pat Lesher

Absent: Kristen Smith

Fr. Greg opened with prayer and the Vestry meeting called to order at 7 p.m.

BUSINESS:

- 1. Approve May Vestry Minutes. A motion was made to approve May 20, 2025 Minutes. M-S-A
- 2. Finance Report-PPP Refund. Deb reported we are right on target with pledges. We received an ERTC refund of \$14,234 and are expecting another \$1,147.22. Don M. has talked with a gentleman from Paychex who originally informed us of this program. He said hasn't heard of a company not getting the full amount. The amount in our case was over \$25,000. Paychex hasn't done anything to find out initially what was going on. Then the checks just showed up. The rep said he would inquire why Epiphany didn't get the full amount. So maybe in the next year or so the remainder will show up. Fr. Greg inquired about Worship under expenses being up to 94% if that is normal. Deb explained the supply organist is in that figure and not under salaries, which in turn is only at 37%. A motion was made to approve the May Finance Report. M-S-A
- 3. Key Bank-Safe Deposit Box/Church Safe. The documents that were in the Chili Center Safe Deposit Box are now in the Church safe. All the documents from the sale of the Rectory on Westside Drive to the VanBrederodes were there. Gladys is looking them over to see if we need to keep them, maybe just for historical purposes. The original Charter of the church from the 1800's plus a negative copy (A suggestion was made to post the original Charter or a copy) Deb, Dave P. and Nick volunteered to look through the remainder of the documents to see what is important to keep or not.
- 4. Church Audit. Since she was the one being audited, Deb deferred to the auditors to speak to the Church Audit. The very extensive document was put online for the Vestry's review. A motion was made to approve the Church Audit. M-S-A. Nick said the audit went well. There were no issues that were brought up in the audit. They did discuss not keeping as much money in the savings and checking accounts. This money could be invested in something short-term that would earn interest. Representatives of Key Bank will possibly meet with the Finance Committee prior to the August Vestry meeting to propose what options are out there for investment, which in turn will be reported to the Vestry at the August meeting.
- 5. Strategic Planning update.
 - a. Welcome and Invitation. Laurie related that they discussed bringing back an idea where groups of 2 or 3 people would host dinner at their house once a month, invite newcomers that don't yet have friends in the parish and mix it up so they can get to know more people in the parish. They hope to bring this to fruition in the near future. They would also like to either display a PRIDE flag or sign. They will check with the town of Gates to see if there are regulations for a permanent sign. After discussion a motion was made to allocate the Welcome Committee up to \$250.00 to purchase a sign and the freedom to decide what it looks like. M-S-A. Through our relationship with Seabury Woods, we're doing a monthly seniors Lunch and Learn program. The first one, in July will be the Gates police doing a workshop on fraud and how to protect yourself. This program will be held on the 3rd Monday of the month at noon, not just for Epiphany and Seabury, but the whole community. Fr. Greg emailed all the clergy in Gates and Chili and the GC3 to spread the word about the lunch

and Learn program. Another program we're doing with Seabury Woods beginning on Mondays at 1 p.m. is chair yoga for seniors in the Auxiliary Room at Epiphany.

b. Liturgy. Nick reported they had their meeting on Sunday and talked about getting the youth more involved with the services. Organizing a semi-annual youth mass during the 10 a.m. service where the youth would do all the functions and the sermon would be directed towards the youth. The first one they are proposing is in October once they have talked with the kids. Also make sure the youth are involved in all the aspects of Christmas and Easter services for the coming year. They also talked about enhancing the music with more diversity. Possibly guitar folk mass or other instruments that our parishioners play.

- c. Youth. Sue relayed they have one new member, George Phillips. They felt him out about teaching and possibly being involved in the next upcoming Rite 13 because there would be 2 boys and a girl. He did mention he is an artist and if there's anything he can add to our youth events by participating and getting kids involved, he would like that. They would like to have two youth services next year, one in October and one in March. For this summer they added July 19th from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. a youth event with a movie and games with s'mores and bonfire; around 7 everybody and invited the Turkish community. Sue said she talked to Don about updating the Rite 13 curriculum that is about 20 years old. We will need a new license because we haven't upgraded. Nick said there is money in the budget under Youth to fund the new license.
- d. Adult Formation and Fellowship. Kathie reported they had lots of good ideas put out there. Donna suggested a male singer, Chris Wilson, a recording artist originally from Brockport who has had a career out West for many years but who has moved back to the area. He sings faith-based songs and is a fantastic guitarist. We would select a date that works for him and the Church to perform at the Church which would also be open to the community. With this event, it brings us together as parishioners and just getting people in the community to know we are here. They discussed having a cookout or dinner out for the adults and having the Rite 13 girls babysit. Also, discussed Wednesday night cafe but nothing definite. More information to follow.
- e. Community Engagement. Don V reported they had a light turnout for the meeting. They spent a lot of time talking about posting to Facebook and the website. Stephen Richards, the photographer that came when the Bishop was at Epiphany gave us some feedback on our Facebook posts., i.e. tape them horizontally, not only stained glass windows and solemn events, but people having fun and laughing. As a result, they started a list of events that they wanted to post about. Hoping to repost a nice public event that is happening both on Facebook and Instagram. They talked about members sharing event pictures and posting them. Fr. Greg offered to let the office create that on SharePoint (that a company put up for us) so we can give anybody who needs access to it. So, it's part of the church's system. Kathie relayed that they have gained a few people videotaping, but we have to remind them about putting date up so if people want to go back to see a particular service. It's all manual now but they hope to have it set up so it's mostly. automated. They want to redo the website, which is a fairly big project. Fr. Greg will give them the name of someone who has set up quite a few websites in the Diocese.
- f. Fr. Greg read off the other sheet of signups that included lecturers, ushers, greeters, etc. to let him know if anybody was new. Also, a suggestion to expand the role for MOE. The only thing they do now is go to breakfast (mostly retirees). They used to have monthly dinners which all the men could attend. Talked about the possibility of bringing back monthly dinners.
- 6. Organ Replacement Task Force Proposal. The piano arrives Thursday, hopefully. It was supposed to arrive last Wednesday, but the moving company had a glitch. So, we should be enjoying it Sunday and that Jack will be here to play it. There should be a discussion about the suggested option(b) which is to enhance the job description from just an organist to Director of Music at 10 hours a week. It would be the next step in our process and then the step after that we had recommended is eventually replacing our organ with a new electronic organ comparable to one we have. After much discussion about the duties and responsibilities of a Director of Music, when the change would take place, how this position would be funded for the remainder of 2025 and how it would be funded in the 2026 budget with many viable recommendations, a motion was made

to approve Option b, expand the organist to Music Director quarter time 10 hours a week. M-S-A. We had contracted with John Shearer to consult with us through the organ replacement process for a fee of \$750. A motion was made to authorize a check for payment of \$750 to John Shearer for services rendered. M-S-A Further discussion of purchasing an organ was delayed until after hiring the Director of Music. This will be included in the advertisement saying the organist we hire would be involved in the future purchase of our new organ. The congregation still needs to be engaged in this organ replacement process. Fr. Greg will write something up for STAR relating to what Vestry has been doing in relation to the organ replacement. Let the congregation know the Vestry is leaning towards Option 1 (replacing it with an electronic/digital organ). The Vestry wants to be transparent, and we are planning to advertise for the Music Director. A coffee hour was also suggested as a means of talking about Option 1.

- 7. Computer Update. Fr. Greg reported all is good. We did spend more money than budgeted for the company because there were some glitches beyond that move. It was \$400 more than the approved amount. Everything is in place. We just have to do the work to get it clean and working. The system is working well. The office is now able to share files online.
- 8. Grant Application. Kathie reported that she and Deb attended an online meeting last week about the new process which seems to be easier to follow and less wordy for the application. So hopefully she can get the grant team together in the next couple of weeks and get the process started. She now has a team together and will begin the application process. Fr. Greg said the grants have changed so there is a line item in one of the grants that says you could apply some of that for a new startup grant that could be applied to a music program. Since we're starting a new music program, it might be possible to do that. Kathie will check that out. The application is due at the end of July. Fr. Greg just received word today that we will be receiving a district grant of \$600 this year from the Diocese. We now belong to one of 3 convocations, formerly we were 5 districts. Convocation is a cluster of parishes that do some work together. You can pool it with other parishes for a specific purpose or keep it for your own parish project. We just must tell them how we're going to use it. Use suggestion made for signage.
- 9. Nominating Committee/delegate. Nothing to report yet.
- 10. Vestry Contact/Vestry Views. Possibly Kristen for July/August. Laurie for September.

Fr. Greg closed the meeting with prayer. A motion was made to adjourn the Vestry meeting at 8:45. M-S-A The next Vestry meeting is August 19, 2025.
