# VESTRY VIEWS OCTOBER 2025

The Stewardship team asked if I could share a testimonial or story that shares why I attend our church and the way I try to share my gifts with the world. This was not an easy task for me because I only feel comfortable sharing my words with close friends and family.

I have been an Episcopalian all my life but like many I stopped attending church upon graduation from high school. Life was busy with college years and then 12-hour night shifts as a RN.

Life was cruising along until autumn of 1992. I moved, got married, and lost my father to lung cancer in a span of 8 weeks. A week after I lost my father I accepted an RN position at a new hospital. As part of my orientation, I had to take a medication exam before I could start on the unit. During the exam my brain just froze, and tears started to flow. A nun who was monitoring the room asked me to come outside in the hall and sit with her. I was so embarrassed, but I could not hold back the tears. She sat with me as I cried. I don't know how to explain it, but I could feel such warmth and healing in my soul. I will never forget the kindness in her eyes.

I believe this moment showed me how kindness and compassion can affect another person's life. Throughout my life I have tried to give back to others with what I call kindness moments. From holding a patient's hand when they are scared and alone to taking the time to help a frail man who has lost his car in the Wegmans parking lot. It is through these small acts of kindness that I try to share Jesus's message of loving one another to the world.

My husband and I started attending Epiphany 27 years ago and have found a warm and supportive community. Our children were raised here, and we have met so many kind people throughout our years at Epiphany. My husband and I feel it is important to give back to our church community so others can feel God's love and blessings in their lives.

Dear Church of the Epiphany,

At the heart of our strategic pastoral plan is the commission by Christ to spread the good news of God's love to the world around us. The self-study that we did last year told us that the greatest gift our parish has to offer the world is YOU - the genuinely warm, welcoming, and inclusive community here at Epiphany. This is how the good news of God is being manifested here. The question is, how do we share this community with others?

With this in mind, we have set goals in several different areas of parish life. One of those key areas I want to focus on is liturgy. Knowing that quality and singable music is an important aspect of our worship services, we made the decision to move from hiring an



Organist for an hour on Sunday to a Director of Music 10 hours a week. We advertised the position, received six applicants, interviewed four of them, and decided in the end the best candidate was Jack Fecik, who had been our Organist for the last six months or so. We offered him the position, and he accepted.

#### Among Jack's goals are:

- to work with the choir to improve the quality of song,
- to work with our youth, and
- to organize concerts that can reach out to the wider Gates/Chili community.

Progress is being made toward these goals. Jack has already taken the initiative to schedule choir rehearsals on Wednesday nights. Another goal of our plan is to organize a youth mass four times a year. We met and created plans for our first youth mass on October 26 at 9:30 AM. Our youth and children will be involved in all aspects of the liturgy. The music, prayers, and sermon will all be geared towards them. Jack is working with our youth on the music for that service. Finally, we have a concert by Chris Wilson, a singer-songwriter, scheduled for Thursday, October 23 at 6:30 PM. Beautiful flyers have been created and sent out to every church in the Gates/Chili area, the Gates Chili Community Connections (GC3), the Episcopal Diocese, and all of our parishes.

As we continued to discern the replacement of our organ, it became clear, for several reasons, that we should upgrade our piano. After exploring a number of different options, we arrived at a baby grand piano that came to us through Jim & Linda Wackerow from a parishioner at Trinity Episcopal Church in Greece. Our research determined that this 1930 Chickering piano was a quality instrument. This was confirmed when our Director of Music, Jack Fecik, and parishioner, John Phillips, went with me to play it. It had a beautiful rich sound, and at \$1000, the price was incredibly generous. As many of you have seen and heard by now, it has been installed at church and is becoming acclimated to our space. The plan for now is to alternate playing the piano and the organ every other week.

Next, let me write a little bit about our upcoming stewardship campaign. One of the things that strikes me about the Episcopal Church (coming from the Roman Catholic world) is the degree to which parishioners feel a sense of belonging to and ownership of the parish. Perhaps it's the more democratic nature of the Episcopal Church, but the level of parishioner involvement in the life of the parish is delightfully impressive. I can't think of one person who doesn't serve in some role or other, or on a committee or in a ministry. You are all quite wonderful!

The one thing that surprises me though is that we consistently approve and operate with a deficit budget. We anticipate that our expenses will be greater than our income by something around \$40,000 each year. Some call it a faith budget, saying that it always seems to work out fine in the end, but if I were the CEO of a small company I would probably be fired.

Now there are a couple factors that help us reduce this deficit. One is the fact that we have a moderate endowment that we can draw from each year. This of course is at the mercy of the stock market and therefore has its ups and downs. In addition, the Diocese offers grant money to help subsidize parish operating budgets like ours. I have sat on the Diocesan Council now for several years and each year it seems the number and amount of grant requests increases,

while the amount of money available has stayed more or less the same. What this means is there is a decreasing amount of money available for any one parish.

With all this in mind, I want to make a strong plea that, barring any significant hardship, you consider increasing your pledge to the parish to help close the deficit gap. We aren't sitting idle. We are working hard to grow the parish and spread the good news far and wide. I personally plan to increase my pledge by 10%. All of this having been said, I know that some of you are on a limited or fixed income, and don't have resources to be able to make any kind of increase. If this is your situation, please don't make this your concern, nor feel bad if you can't increase your support. We do what we can.

However, if you can, please consider increasing your pledge.

# **VESTRY MINUTES AUGUST 19, 2025**

Tim opened with prayer. The Vestry meeting was called to order at 7 p.m.

#### **BUSINESS:**

- 1. Approve June Vestry Minutes. A motion was made to approve June 17, 2025, Minutes. M-S-A
- 2. Website update/gift from Diocese. Kim reported that during a meeting of the Social Media group they discussed upgrading the Epiphany website along with being more active on it and posting more regularly (sermons, photos, events, etc.) Right now, Kim does most of the posting to the website and all team members update Facebook and Instagram.

Fr. Greg told Kim the Diocese has a new initiative grant that could be used for upgrading our website or a new sign in front of the church. It seems like the money from the grant would be more in line with upgrading the website. He asked Kim if she would contact some Website designers for ballpark figures to upgrade our website for the grant application. She contacted 3 different website designers, giving details of what we wanted from them and the cost per year. They ranged from \$1,000.00 to \$5,000.00 onetime charge: with monthly ongoing costs from \$100.00 - \$250.00 for maintenance, backup and web hosting a year. One firm said they would do the upgrade for \$3,000 .00 and then turn it over to us with no monthly cost but we would be responsible for doing monthly work such as adding to the calendar and adding our videos and pictures etc. The grant has been written asking for the maximum of \$5,000. Kim passed out the information sheets so that the Vestry is aware while we

are waiting for this grant. Discussion followed, what happens if Kim leaves; better to have a service to update information passed on from church secretary; if we're getting results (hits on website), it's worth it; monthly maintenance fee is costly. Vestry will decide if we use the money to upgrade the sign or potentially upgrade the website. Kim will contact the firm Lil Red, who did the website for the Episcopal Diocese and St Peters to get a quote.

- 3. Stewardship. Deb reported that she and Kim had met to plan the Stewardship campaign. Stewardship will begin on October 5th and end on October 26th. There will be one service on Oct 26<sup>th</sup> at 9:30am, followed by brunch. We will be using The Episcopal Network theme called "Tell out my soul" which has to do with telling our stories and mentioning our gifts inside and outside the community. Deb gave more details about what will be included in the stewardship package.
- 4. Finance Report/PPP. Deb reported for June our income was 56% and our expenses were 48% and we were at a surplus of \$1760 thanks to the IRS. Pledges have been down but that is how Summer usually goes. In July our income was at 61.8% and expenses 57%; we were short at \$8,475. Don M said we are still waiting for \$3,000 from Redwings. Deb related that the Lucidity project is done. Although the proposal for the project was \$3,455 it came in at \$4,151. The money will come from Seabury because it's a capital expense. She also related there are other fees involved in monitoring the system. Fr. Greg said he would check into these fees. She's hoping to give a financial update to the parish in the near future. A motion was made to approve the June/July Finance Report. M-S-A
- 5. Information from Key Bank meeting. Deb related that she, Don, Nick, Dave, Laurie and Kathie met with a Key Bank manager and financial representative. The presentation was on fraud protection in detail and how much the monthly fee would be. Since we are a small church, it was decided it would be too much for us, besides being costly, it would complicate our process. The next thing they talked about was Epiphany's Rewards credit card and it appears Father Greg is the primary card holder. Since he's the primary card holder, the bank will only talk with him. Deb did some research and found out we have 126,182 points which amounts to \$256.34. There was discussion that this amount seems too low since it's a 1% reward, which should be more like \$1,200. There are options to take cash or gift cards for Walmart or Target. Deb will follow up on the discrepancy of the reward amount. Next discussion was the amount of money we have in Checking (\$51,000) and in Savings (\$164,000) as of the end of July. After discussing options to increase our savings, Key Bank suggested an 8-month CD at 31/2%. Right now, we are only earning 2.28 on our savings. So, the recommendation from the Finance Committee is to bring our Checking account down to \$25,000 and put the remainder into Savings. Then take \$100,000 from Savings to invest in either 1 or 2 eight-month CDs at 3½%. Discussion followed if there would be enough money left in the 2 accounts to cover upcoming or ongoing expenses. There will still be \$90,000 (Savings) and \$25,000 (checking). A motion was made to move \$25,000 from checking to savings and put \$100,000 in two CDs for eight months at \$50,000 each. M-S-A.
- 6. Director of Music/Piano-Organ replacement. Fr. Greg reported that four candidates have applied for the position. They will be auditioning four of them this Sunday afternoon. Two are organists and 2 are pianists. He encouraged Jack, our current pianist, to apply. As hoped, creating a bigger position is attractive to potential organists and others. He also said John has lined up another Steinway that belonged to a former RPO musician. Hopefully, it will be placed in the Church soon. A discussion followed about purchasing an electronic organ, an option proposed by the Committee and what the timing would be and the possibility of a capital campaign. Fr. Greg will contact John Shearer, our consultant, for recommendations.
- 7. Signage/Seabury Woods/Grant. Discussed under item 2.

- 8. Nominating Committee/Delegate/Vestry. Fr. Greg talked to Ryan about becoming a delegate to the Convention. He seemed interested and will let him know soon.
- 9. Small group updates/meeting updates; meetings on the second Sunday of every month.
  - a. Welcome. Laurie related that she approached Casey, a young woman who has been coming to Epiphany for 3 or 4 months just to see what her impression is of us. She said she feels so comfortable here, likes the people here, they are so welcoming. She is just so comfortable here that she would like to join the church. Laurie asked her to fill out a blue card that makes it official to become a member. Also welcomed three young women who said they were friends of Jack and were here to support him. They were very friendly and said they hoped to come again.
  - b. Liturgy Planning. Nick reported they met in July and went over their plans for Fall and youth participation on October 26.
  - c. Youth. Sue related they had a summer event-dinner, movies, s'mores and sparklers that were enjoyed by all. Marsha is submitting an article for the STAR that the youth are still collecting cans and bottles. Sunday School is starting September 7th with a family meeting at 9:30, a light breakfast, then at 9:45 classes begin. Lots of planning to do for the youth involvement in the October 26 service. Talked about the commissioning of teachers. This year there will be a Rite 13 class and J2A going at the same time, with a new curriculum. They have 1 teacher in place and are hoping Cassie has a co-teacher. They will be looking at a date for the youth participation in a Sunday service for Spring.
  - d. Adult Formation. Fr. Greg reported we are doing "chair yoga" with Seabury Woods every Monday at 1p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. There are about 20-30 people who show up; mostly from Seabury, from our parish and a few from the community. There's also a "lunch and learn" program with Seabury. It's a monthly luncheon plus a speaker on a topic of relevance to seniors for \$8.00. We have had Dave, a resident at Seabury who is in a wheelchair, come over to church a few times, assisted by George.
  - e. Social Media. Emily is looking into a Google link where we could send pictures in, and the team could put up on the website. Kim is doing a great job of putting pictures of events on Facebook

The beginning of October finds Epiphany involved with two service ministry projects. Epiphany's Red Pantry Box collection will be completed on Sunday, October 5<sup>th</sup>. Although this collection of non-perishable foods and personal hygiene will end on October 5<sup>th</sup>, the need for restocking the Red Box is a yearlong mission for Epiphany. The Pantry Box is stocked daily with non-perishable food items and personal hygiene products and is available for anyone who stops by who is in need. There is a collection

basket in the back of the sanctuary for donations for the Red Pantry Box for yearlong donations.

Epiphany will join with the Gates Chili Community Connections (GC3) on Saturday, October 4th from 9 am -11 am to help pick up trash along the side of the road in Gates. The meeting place for this service project is Dunkin Donuts at 1482 Buffalo Road (corner of Buffalo and Howard Roads). We will work together helping "Keep Gates Clean" which is a volunteer group that is helping keep the Gates roadway free of trash. 

#### SENIORS MAY HAVE THE OPTION TO MAKE THEIR EPIPHANY PLEDGE A TAX-FREE DONATION

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-advantaged way for individuals to support charitable causes, like Epiphany, directly from their retirement accounts. It allows certain taxpayers to donate to qualified charities while also reducing their taxable income.

#### **How It Works**

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to an eligible charity. Instead of withdrawing money, paying income taxes on it, and then making a donation, the funds move straight from the IRA to the nonprofit. This transfer does **not** count as taxable income.

#### **Key Rules**

- Age Requirement: You must be at least 70½ years old at the time of the distribution.
- Eligible Accounts: QCDs can only be made from IRAs (not from 401(k)s or other plans, unless rolled into an IRA first).
- **Annual Limit**: Up to \$100,000 per individual (\$200,000 for married couples filing jointly if both qualify) can be distributed tax-free each year.
- Qualified Charities: Donations must go to IRS-recognized 501(c)(3) organizations. Donor-advised funds and private foundations generally do not qualify.
- Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs): For individuals age 73 or older (as of 2023 law), QCDs can count toward satisfying annual RMDs.
- **Transfer of Funds**: For the distribution to be tax-free, it must be paid directly from the IRA to an eligible charitable organization. *You cannot withdraw the money and then write a check to the organization!*

#### Why Consider a QCD?

- A QCD lowers adjusted gross income, which may reduce exposure to higher tax brackets, Medicare surcharges, and the taxation of Social Security benefits.
- Provides a tax-efficient way to give, especially for those who do not itemize deductions.
- Supports charitable causes with potentially larger gifts due to tax savings.

#### **Bottom Line**

A Qualified Charitable Distribution can be a powerful tool for retirees who want to combine philanthropy with smart tax planning. Before making a QCD, it's wise to consult with a financial advisor or tax professional to ensure the donation meets all IRS requirements and aligns with your retirement strategy.


